



No tropical cyclones expected during the next 5 days


### **Eastern Pacific**



#### **Disturbance 1** (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located S of southern Mexico
- Some slow development possible over the next couple of days
- Formation chance 48 hour: Low (20%); 5-day: Low (30%)

### **Atlantic**



#### Tropical Storm Karl (Advisory #3A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 185 miles NNE of Veracruz, Mexico
- Moving NNW at 6 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend out 105 miles
- Additional strengthening expected for the next day or so



# **Tropical Cyclone Ian**



<u>Current Situation:</u> FEMA and federal partners continue to support the State of Florida in response and recovery from the impacts of Tropical Cyclone Ian. All operations and reports have been transitioned to a fully operational Joint Field Office (JFO). As of Oct 11 438,861 (+31,314) valid registrations for Individual Assistance with over \$210 million (+20M) approved and over \$50.3 million disbursed to survivors. (NRCC SLB, as of 12:00 p.m. ET Oct 11)

#### State / Local Response:


- FL EOC at Full Activation; Governor declared a State of Emergency; FEMA-3584-EM-FL, FEMA-4673-DR-FL Amendment No. 8, and FEMA-4675-DR-STOF approved
- GA EOC at Partial Activation, Governor declared a State of Emergency

#### FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region I IMAT deployed to Tampa, FL
- Region III: IMAT deployed to Lee County EOC, Ft. Myers, FL
- Region IV IMAT-1 deployed to FL EOC; IMAT-2 deployed to Ft. Myers, FL; LNOs deployed to FL, GA, SC, and NC
- Region VIII IMAT deployed to Kissimmee, FL
- FEMA HO: NRCC has deactivated
  - National IMAT White and elements of National IMAT Blue deployed to FL EOC
  - o Elements of National IMAT Gold deployed to Ft. Myers, FL
  - HHS: 7 DMATs deployed FL and will deactivate Oct 13 (Lee, Sarasota, and Charlotte counties)
  - DHS: Surge Capacity Force activated
  - HQ Logistics: ISB and SMTs at Maxwell, AFB (Montgomery, AL) and Warner Robins, GA






# **Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall**








# **Space Weather Summary/Outlook**

Solar Flare (Radio Blackout)   R Scale	R1	45% / 10%	45% / 10%	
Solar Radiation Storms   S Scale	None	10%	10%	
Geomagnetic Storms   G Scale	None	15%	10%	

- Currently have four numbered spot groups on solar disk; two of main interest. Lower level M-class flares over past 48 hours. 10% chance of R3 level activity.
- Slight chance of solar radiation storms through 13 Oct due mainly to favorable location and flare tendency/potential of Region 3112.
- No G1 or greater geomagnetic storms over past 48 hours. Chance of solar wind disturbance due to nearby passing CME from 7 Oct.








