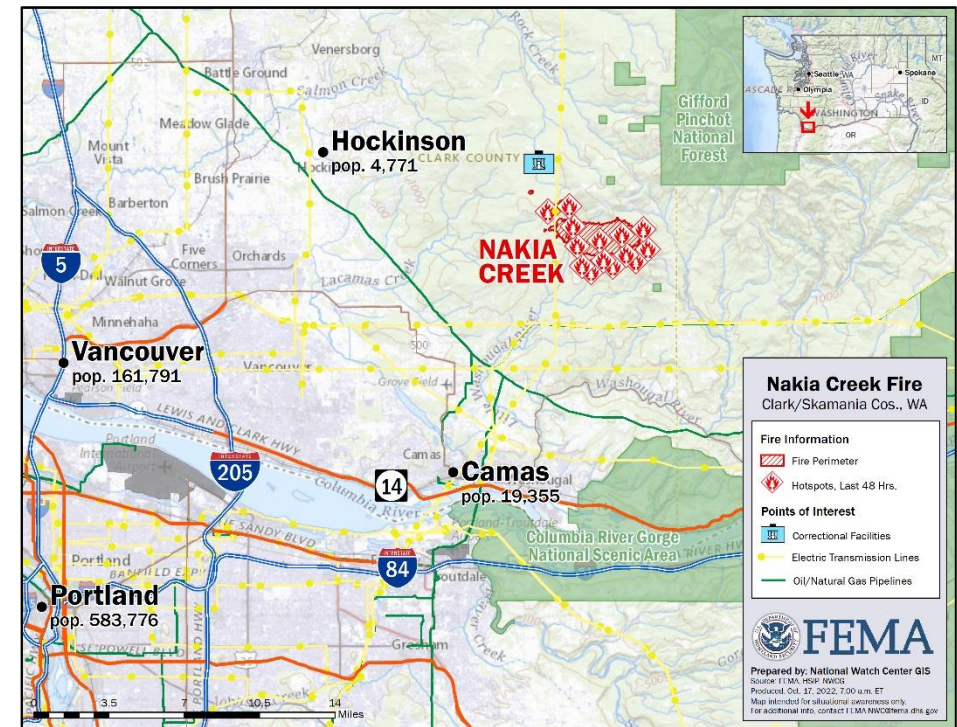

Situation: The fire started on Oct 9 and has burned about 2,200 acres (5% contained) of state and private land. It is currently threatening 1,353 homes in and around the communities of Camas and Hockinson (total pop. 30k). Level 3 (Get Out) evacuations are in effect for 2,706 people. The fire also threatens the Larch Correctional Center which has been evacuated, state timber, manufacturing facilities, agricultural facilities, electrical transmission and distribution lines, recreational facilities, and fuel pipelines.

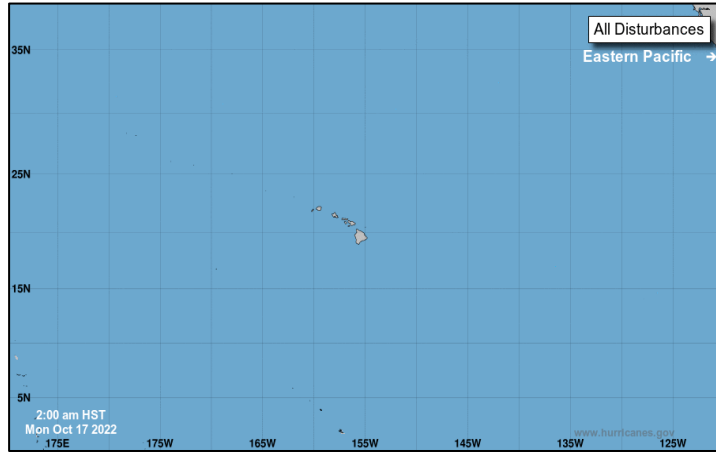

- Bothell MOC and NWC continue to monitor



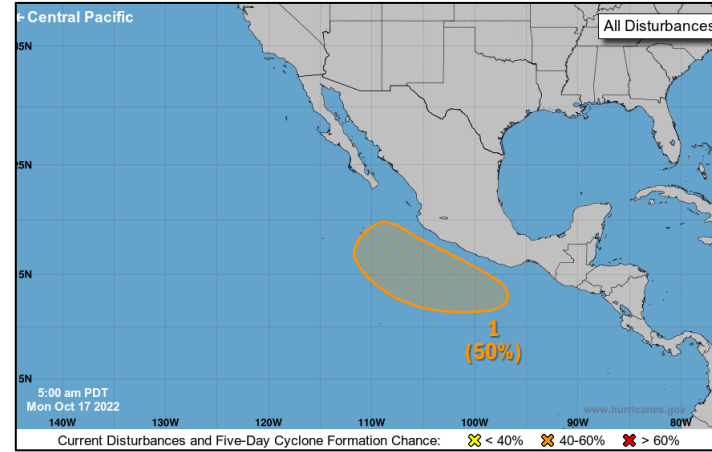
Tropical Outlook – Five Day

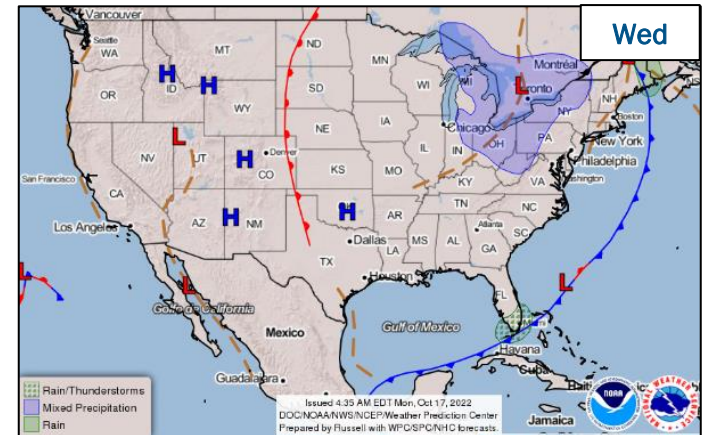

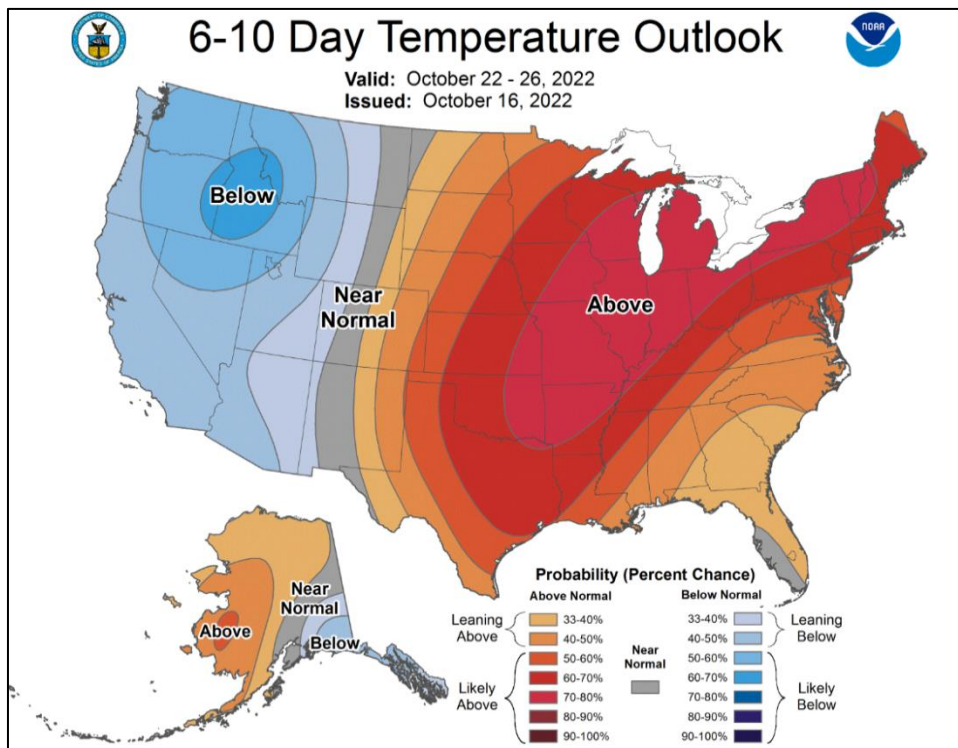
National Weather Forecast



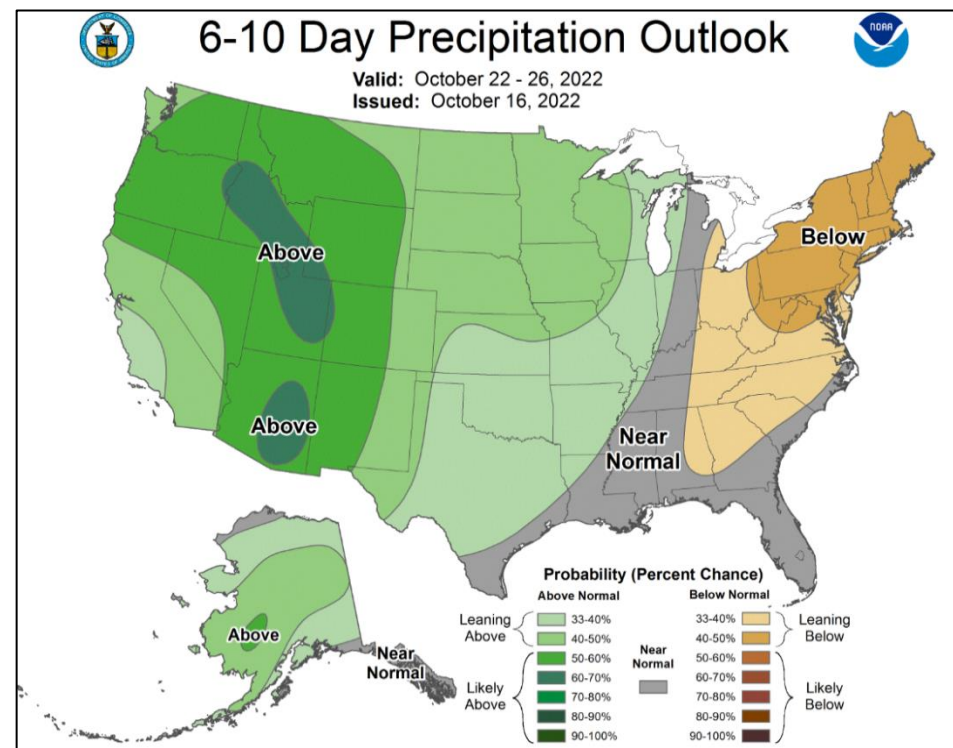

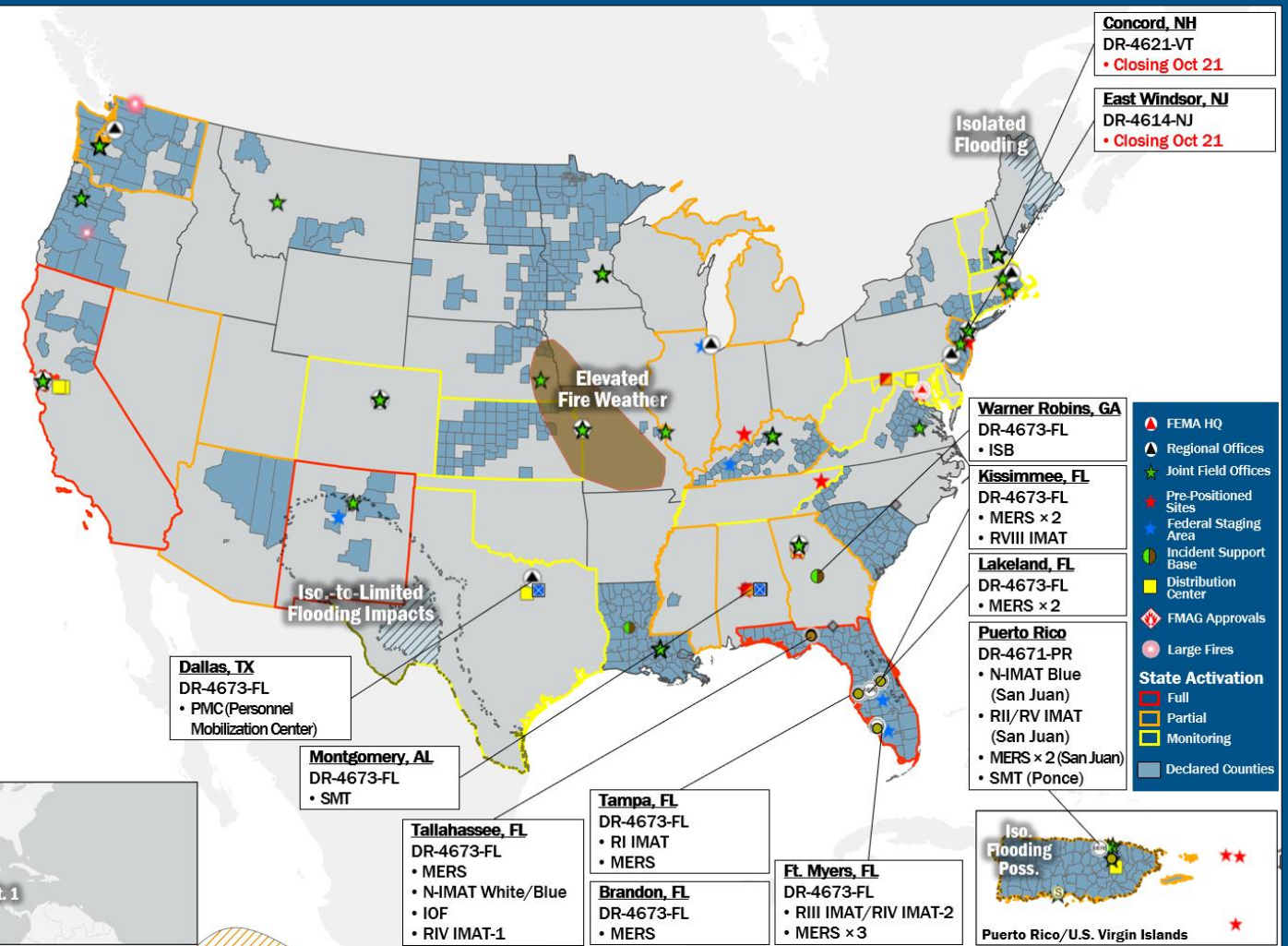

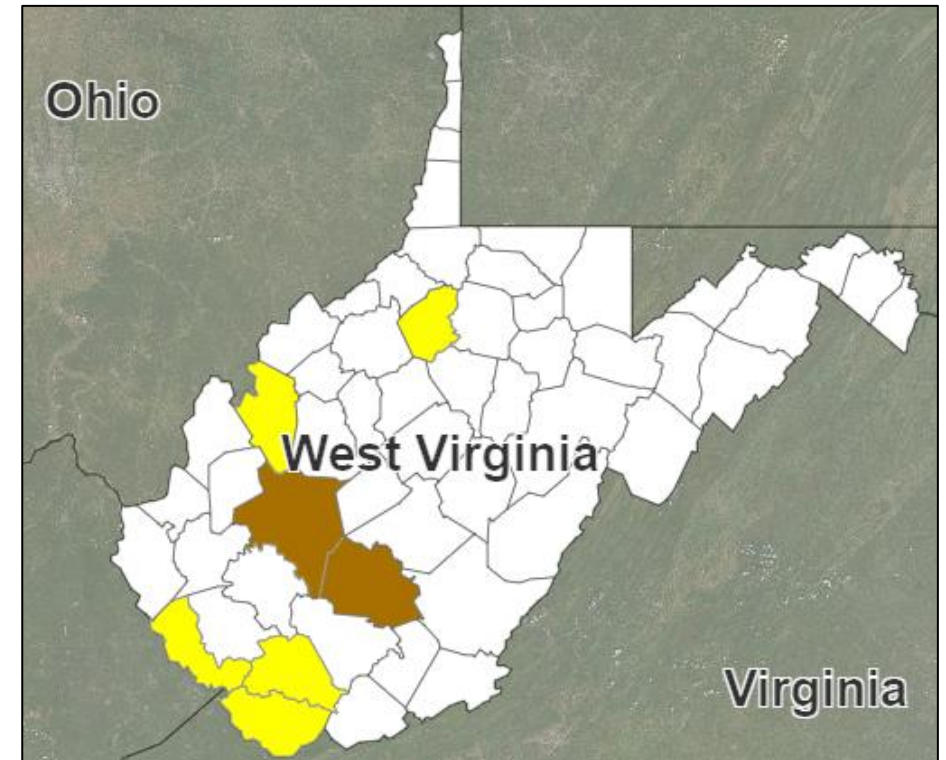
