



Disturbance 1: (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located S of SW Mexico
- Moving W at 15mph away from coast of Mexico
- A tropical depression could form around the middle of next week
- Formation chance: 48-hour Med (60%); 7-day – High (90%)

<u>Tropical Depression Nadine:</u> (Advisory #7 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 85 miles E of Tuxtla Gutierrez, Mexico
- Moving WSW at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 30 mph
- Gradual weakening is expected; forecast to dissipate this morning



Hurricane Oscar (CAT-1) – Atlantic

Situation: (Advisory #5A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 10 miles SW of Great Inagua Island
- Moving WSW at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 80 mph
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward 5 miles; tropicalstorm force winds extend outward 45 miles
- Weakening expected after making landfall

Situation: Locally executed, state managed, and federally supported operations continue.

Lifelines: (TC Helene & Milton SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Oct 19)

- Developing safety guide on landslides for first responders/road maintenance workers/impacted public

Food, Hydration, Shelter:

NC: 11 (-1) shelters / 472 (-48) occupants








National Weather Forecast





Severe Weather Outlook





Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Hazards Outlook - Oct 21-25






Long Range Outlooks - Oct 25-29



6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




