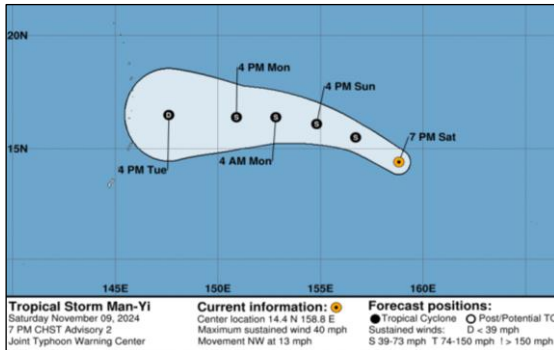

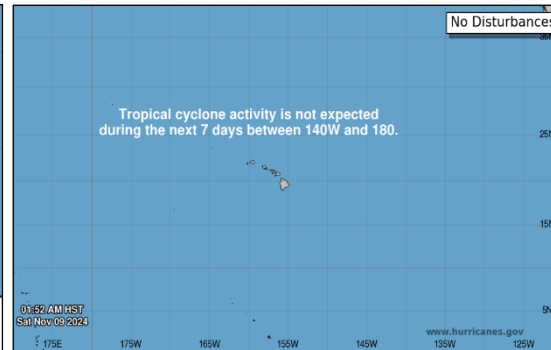

Tropical Storm Man-Yi: (Advisory #2, as of 4:00 a.m. ET)

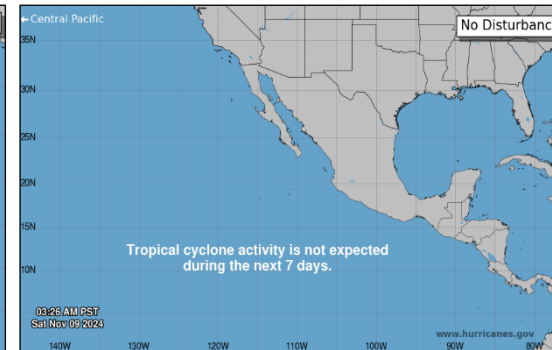
- Located 910 miles E of Guam
- Moving NW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds of 40 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 60 miles
- No significant threat is expected to Tinian, Saipan, Rota, or Guam (Region IX SPOTREP, as of 6:43 a.m. ET)

Central Pacific



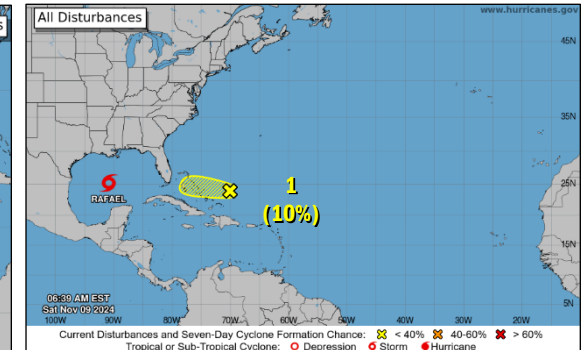
- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days

Tropical Storm Rafael: (Advisory #24 as of 4:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 265 miles NNW of Progreso, Mexico

- Steady weakening is expected during the next few days
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 90 miles

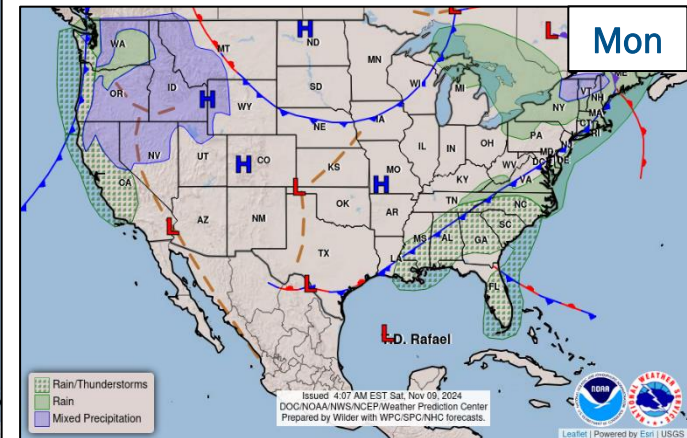
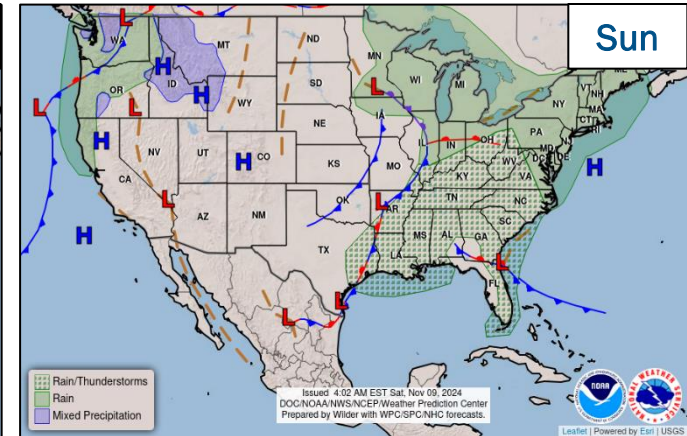
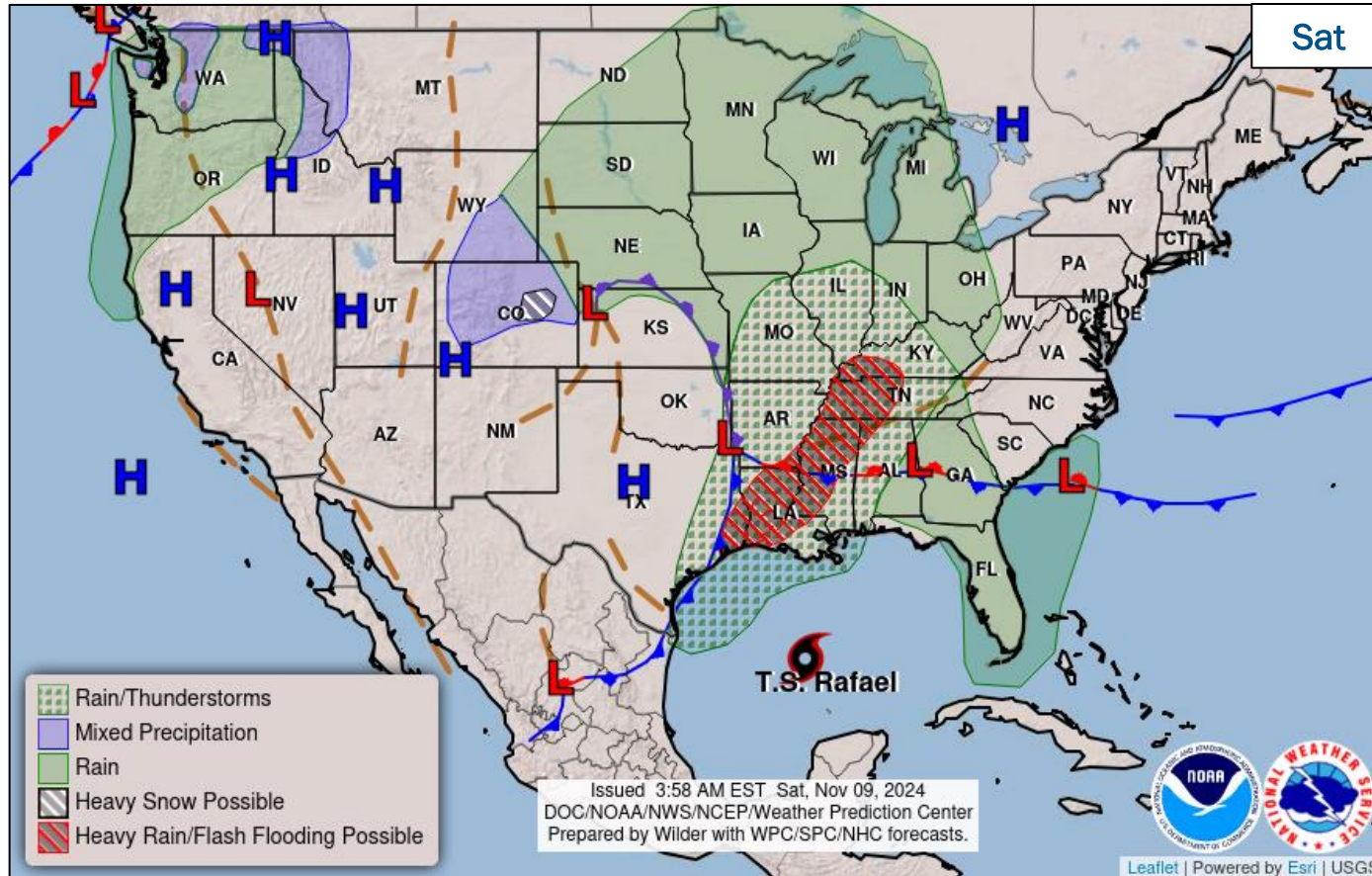
Disturbance 1: (as of 7:00 a.m. ET)

- Formation chance: 48-hour - Low (10%); 7-day - Low (10%)



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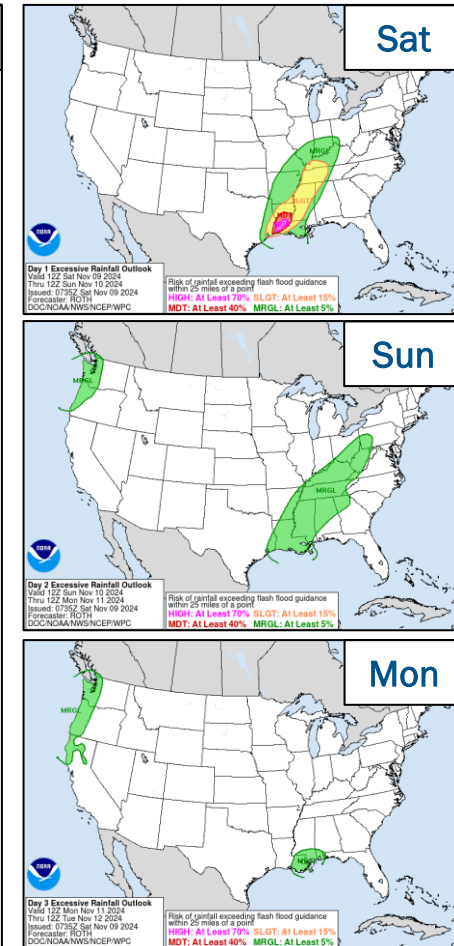
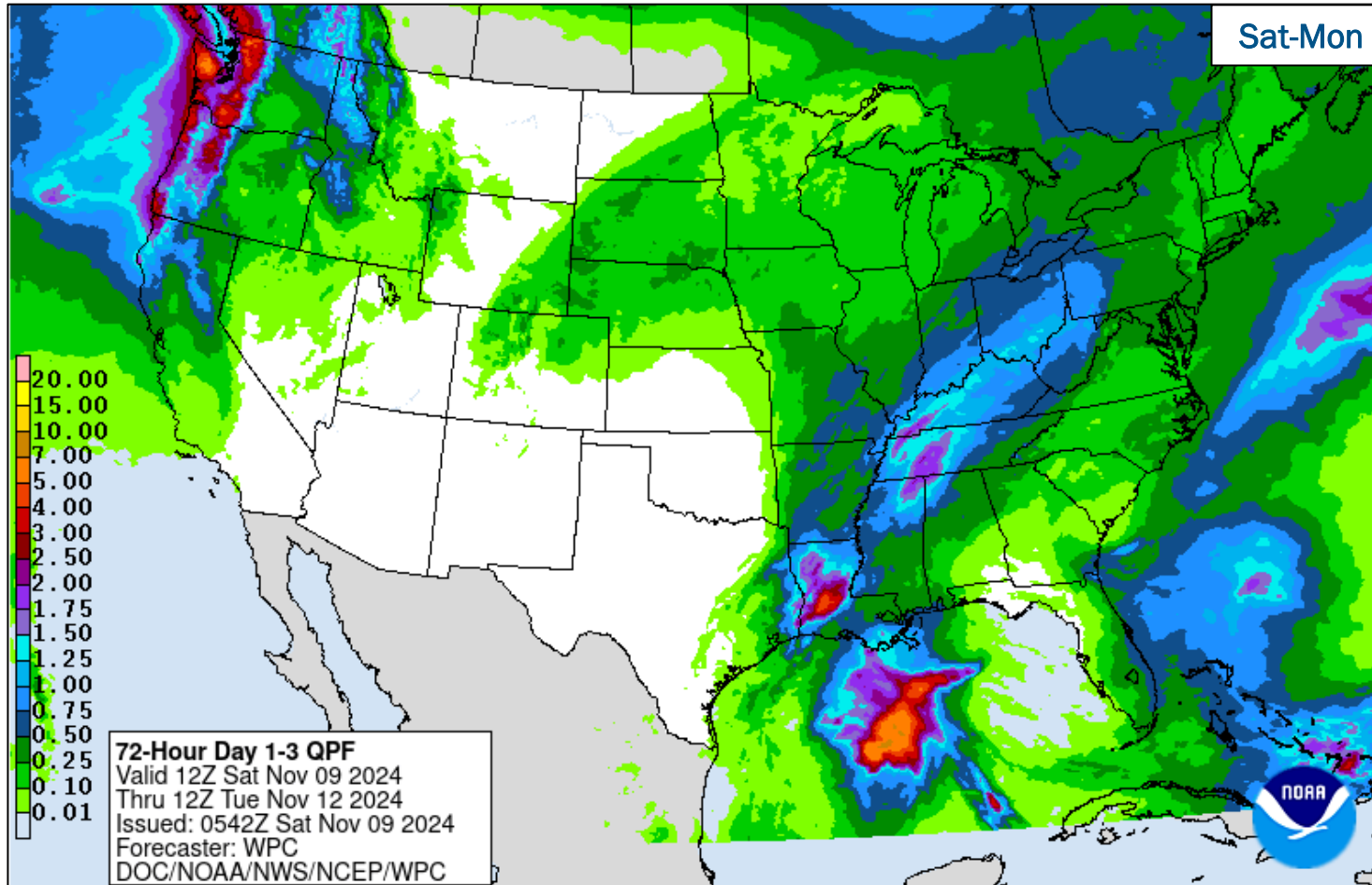
National Weather Forecast



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Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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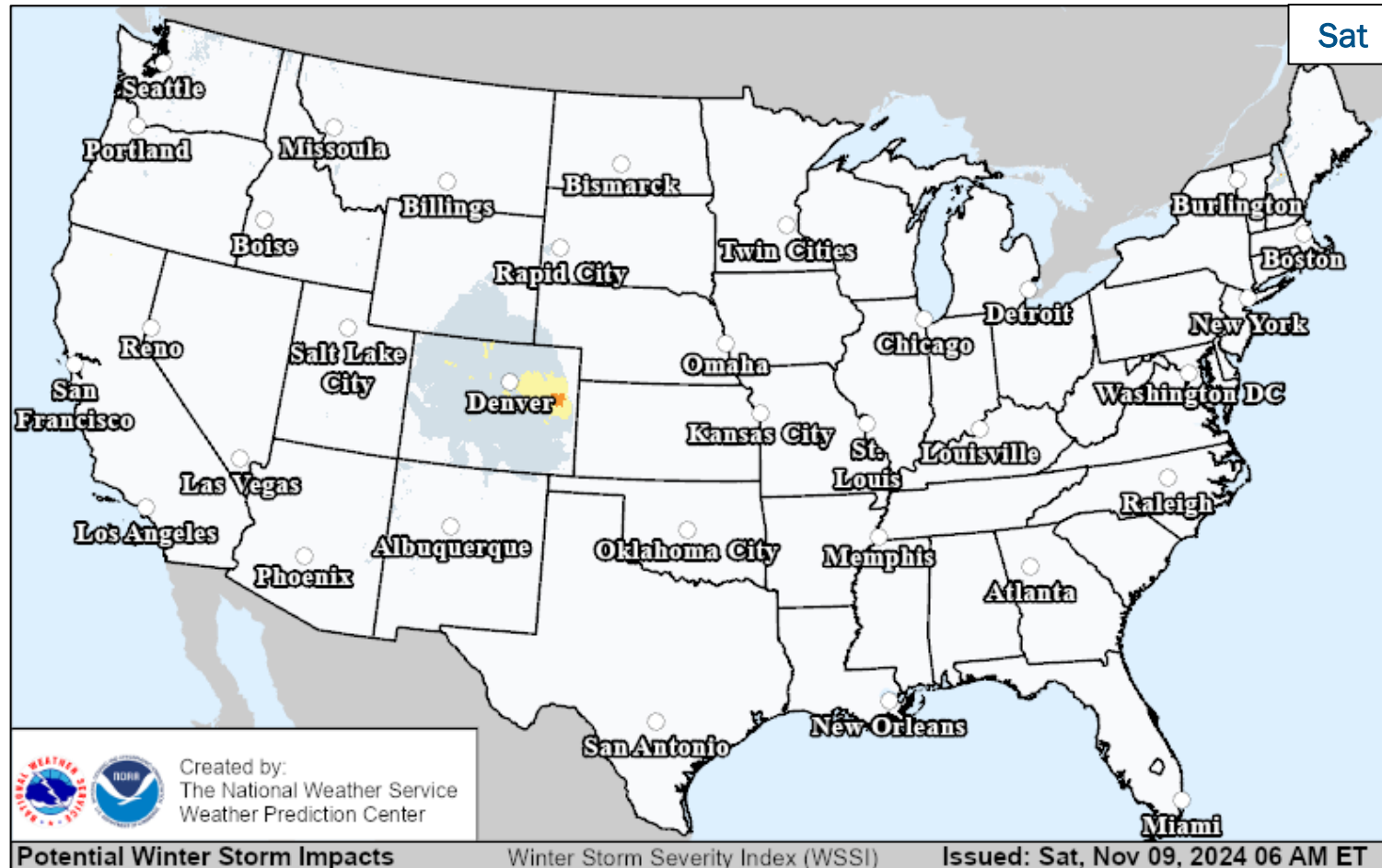
Snowfall Forecast – Nov 9-12
