

Tropical Depression Nicole RADAR LOOP








Tropical Depression Nicole FORECAST TRACK

Tropical Cyclone Nicole - Recovery

<u>Current Situation:</u> On Nov 10, Nicole made landfall as a Category 1 hurricane near Vero Beach, FL, and is moving northward through GA producing heavy rain, strong winds and severe weather. Significant response assets remain in place as part of previous recovery operations.

Lifeline Impacts: (TC Nicole SLB as of Nov 10, 6:30 p.m. ET)

Safety and Security:


- Multiple buildings have collapsed due to prolonged coastal erosion
- All buildings deemed unsafe in Brevard, Flagler, St. Lucie, and Volusia counties have been evacuated
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for parts of Clay and Volusia counties
- One wall on a retention dam has failed allowing water to flow from Rose Bay into a neighborhood in Port Orange, FL

Food, Water, Shelter:

17 shelters open with 486 occupants

Health and Medical:

• 45 medical facilities on generator power; 10 medical facilities evacuated *Energy:* 44k customers without power; 356k peak outages at 11:00 a.m. ET, Nov 10 (Eagle-1 as of 7:00 a.m. ET)



Transportation:

- Highway A1A closed at multiple locations due to erosion; FDOT conducting assessments
- All major airports reopened; seaports anticipated to reopen today




Tropical Cyclone Nicole - Recovery

 - RWC is monitoring; RRCC at Level III (day shift) with select ESFs, DCE, and USCG
 - IMAT-1 deployed to FL EOC; IMAT-2 deployed to Ft. Myers, FL (Hurricane Ian)
 - FEMA-3587-EM-FL approved Nov 8; FEMA-3588-EM-STOF approved Nov 9
- FEMA Region VIII IMAT deployed to Lake Mary, FL (Hurricane Ian)
- 2.4k FEMA personnel deployed in support of Hurricane Ian (FEMA-4673-DR-FL)
- FEMA HQ:
 - N-IMAT White deployed to JFO in Brandon, FL (Hurricane Ian)
 - NWC returned to normal operations


State / Local Response:

- FL EOC at Full Activation (Hurricane lan/Tropical Cyclone Nicole)
- FL Gov declared a State of Emergency for 67 counties
- 577 FL NG personnel activated in support of Nicole






National Weather Forecast






Severe Weather Outlook





Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall




