



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National Weather Forecast







West Coast Atmospheric River



Atmospheric River – Regions IX and X

Current Situation: Northern California and parts of the Pacific Northwest are bracing for what is expected to be the most impactful storm the region has seen in nearly two decades, with strong winds starting to cause power outages. The Weather Prediction Center issued excessive rainfall risks that began Tuesday and lasts through Friday. The storm system is considered a bomb cyclone, which occurs when a cyclone intensifies rapidly. The areas that could see particularly severe rainfall will likely reach from the south of Portland, Oregon, to the north of San Francisco, CA.

Lifeline Impacts:

Energy: (DOE Eagle-I as of 8:30 a.m. ET)

- WA: 600k power outages / 18% statewide
 - King County: 445K / 45%
 - Snohomish County: 72k / 11%
 - Kitsap County: 21k / 16%
 - Pierce County: 11k / 7%
- Minimal power outages (less than 1% statewide) in California and Oregon


State / Local Response:

- WA EOC: Normal Operations
- CA and OR EOCs: Normal Operations

FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region IX and Region X RWCs are Monitoring
- RWC is Monitoring; NRCC is at Steady State
- NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with Regions IX and X, with continued reporting twice daily in the FEMA National Situation Report (5:00 p/m. ET / 3:00 a.m. ET) and the FEMA daily Operations Briefing (8:30 a.m. ET)







