



- Located 385 miles ENE of the northwestern Bahamas
- Moving WNW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds are 50 mph
- Nicole is expected to make a transition to a tropical storm later today and begin strengthening, and it is forecast to be near or at hurricane strength by Wednesday and Wednesday night
- Nicole's center is then expected to move across central and northern Florida into southern Georgia Thursday and Thursday night

<u>Disturbance 1</u> (as of 7:00 a.m. ET)


- Located 750 miles E of Bermuda
- Chance for significant development is quickly diminishing
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (30%); 5-day: Low (30%)




Subtropical Storm Nicole RFC RIVER FORECASTS

Subtropical Storm Nicole - Preparations

Current Situation:

On the forecast track, Subtropical Storm Nicole will approach the east coast of Florida Wednesday night and be at or near hurricane intensity. Hurricane conditions are possible within the watch area in Florida by Wednesday night, with tropical storm conditions possible by tonight or early Wednesday.

Hurricane Watches are in effect for a portion of the east coast of Florida, including West Palm Beach and Ft. Lauderdale. Tropical Storm Warnings and Watches are in effect for the rest of the east coast of Florida, parts of coastal Georgia, and some inland areas, including Orlando. Storm Surge Warnings and Watches are in effect for the east coast of Florida and parts of coastal Georgia.

Heavy rainfall is also forecast with localized rainfall totals up to 7 inches possible in southeast Florida and southeast Georgia through Thursday. Heavy rainfall from this system will spread north farther up the Eastern Seaboard late this week into this weekend.








National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Forecast Snowfall






