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Forecasted Flooding Threat – Pacific Northwest

Situation: Significant flooding and landslides are expected across parts of the Pacific Northwest starting late Monday and continuing through the week. A series of frontal systems will bring periods of heavy rainfall to southwestern Washington and Oregon through at least the middle of next week, resulting in considerable river flooding as well as widespread urban and small stream flooding. The greatest flooding impacts are anticipated from Monday night through Wednesday, when the heaviest rainfall is expected. Forecasts indicate minor to isolated major river flooding, with rapid rises beginning late Monday evening especially in the foothills of the Cascades and continuing into late next week. Many rivers and streams are expected to experience multiple peaks throughout the week as several rounds of rainfall move through the region. While the exact magnitude and extent of flooding may fluctuate depending on the timing of rainfall. Confidence remains high that significant flooding impacts will occur.

Possible Threats:

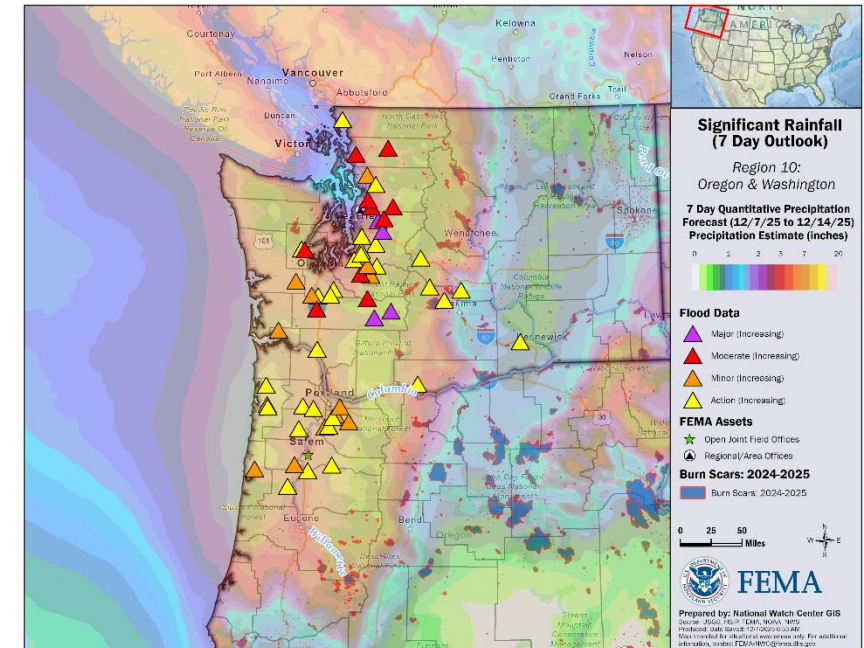
- Heavy Rainfall
 - 2 - 4" isolated higher amounts up to 6" in lowlands
 - 5 - 10" in the mountains
- Flooding
 - Significant flooding is expected in the Cascade foothills of western Washington, including urban areas, small streams, and rivers. Moderate to isolated major river flooding is likely, with initial crests anticipated from Tuesday evening into Wednesday morning. Prolonged rainfall will cause multiple, compounding flood waves, and the risk of flooding along slow-responding rivers will persist even after rainfall subsides.
- Landslides
 - Periods of heavy rain over increasingly moist soils will elevate the risk of landslides in steep terrain and debris flows in areas recently affected by wildfires, as saturated soils make these regions particularly vulnerable.

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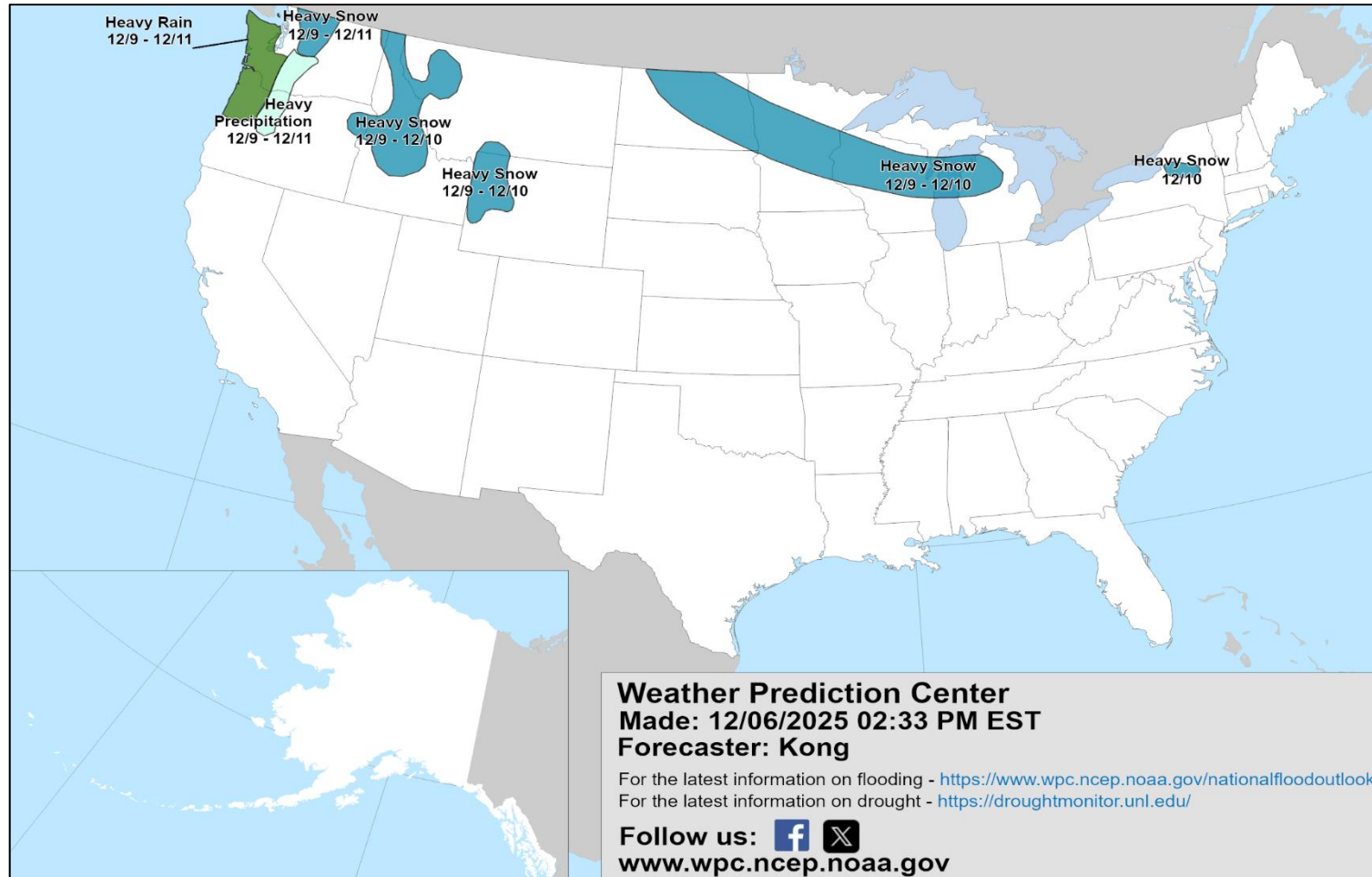
National Weather Forecast

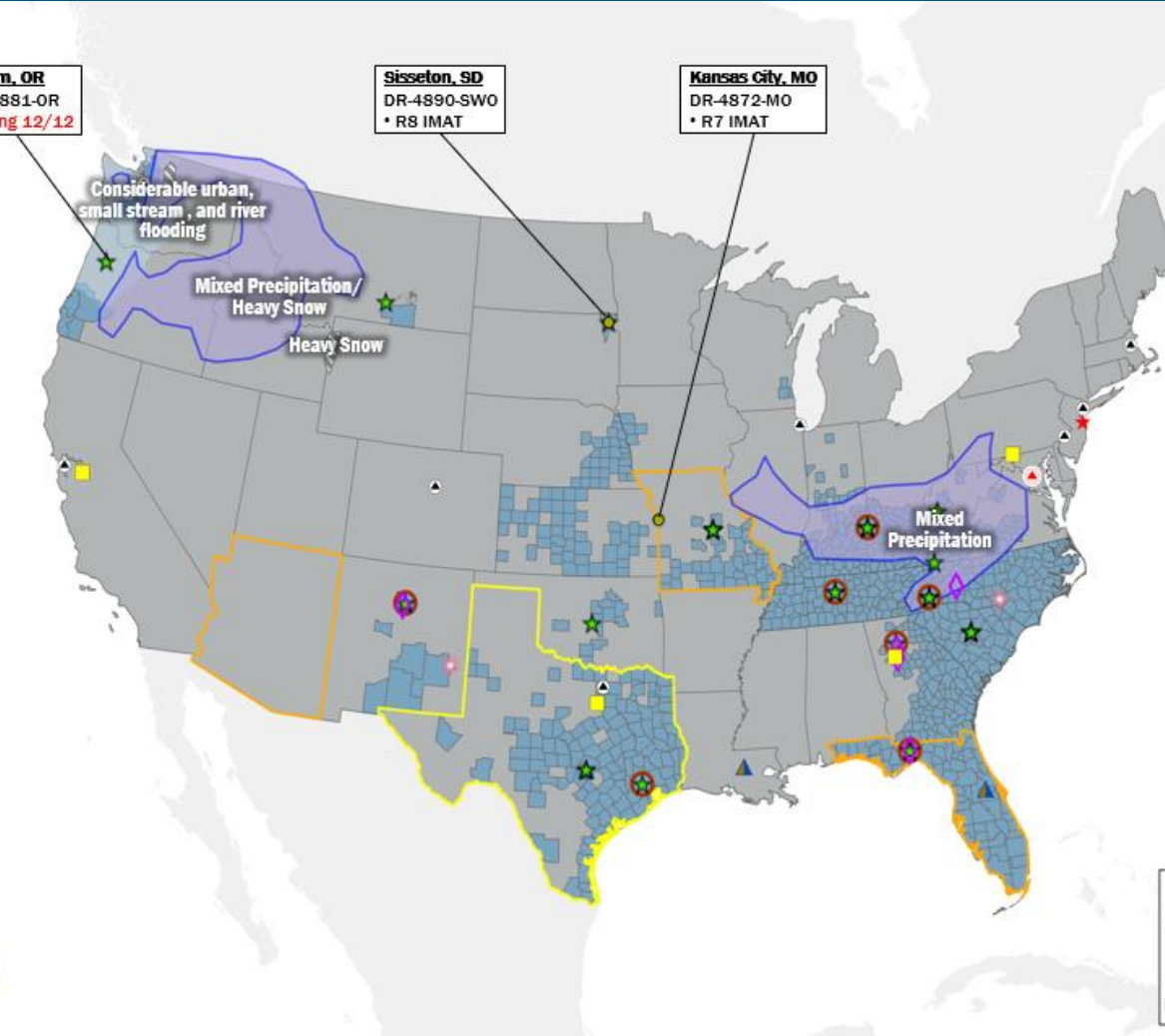
