Arctic Blast – Impacts

Situation: A significant and disruptive storm system is producing a multitude of weather hazards as heavy snowfall, strong winds, and dangerously cold temperatures span across the Central and Eastern U.S.

Impact Summary :

No major/widespread property damage or power outages identified; transportation disruptions have been the most widely reported impact

- **Transportation:** All major airport hubs are open, although numerous flight cancellations have been reported. (*FAA*, various media sources, 7:15 a.m. ET)
 - Charlotte IAP reported a full ground stop this morning due to weather. (FAA)
 - More than 2.5k flight cancellations and 10K flight delays across the U.S. on 22 Dec (CISA, DHS NOC)
- Power: Approx. 943k customers without power nationwide, the majority of which are in TX, GA, SC, and CT (DOE, 8amET)
- Shelters:
 - o Hundred of warming shelters open across the impacted areas
 - 7 ARC shelters open overnight with 559 occupants, the majority of which were in CO (6/554) (ARC, 6:00 a.m. ET)
- Fatalities: 2 confirmed (KS/MO) (Region VII RWC)


- CT: 100k (6.29%) customers without power (EAGLE-I, 8:00 a.m. ET)
- MA: 56k (1.74%) customers without power (EAGLE-I, 8:00 a.m. ET)

Region II:

- NY: Mandatory evacuations in effects for Hoover Beach neighborhood in Hamburg (Erie Co.), NY, due to potential for lakeshore flooding
- NY/NJ: New York-area airports (EWR, LGA, JFK) reporting ground delays

Region IV:

- Media reports warming shelters open in states across region
- GA: 93k (2.03%) customers without power (EAGLE-I, 8:00 a.m. ET)
- SC: 74k (2.69%) customers without power (EAGLE-I, 8:00 a.m. ET)
- NC: 73k (1.51%) customers without power (EAGLE-I, 8:00 a.m. ET)



Region VI:

- TX: 7 warming centers in San Antonio; 1 Red Cross shelter in El Paso
- TX: 78k (0.62%) customers without power (EAGLE-I, 8:00 a.m. ET)

Region VII:

- Roads and interstates closed throughout region, including I-80 in IA
- KS: One confirmed fatality
- MO: One confirmed fatality; 374 warming sites open/on standby

Region VIII:

- SD: 2 shelters open for Rosebud Sioux Tribe (pop. 6)
- CO: 6 shelters open (pop. 554); 21 warming centers established




National Weather Forecast







Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Forecast Snowfall





Hazards Outlook – Dec 25-29


