Significant Events: Severe thunderstorms and tornadoes – AL and GA

**Tropical Activity:** No activity affecting U.S. interests

#### Significant Weather:

- Heavy rain, snow, and flash flooding possible CA, including burn scar areas
- Heavy snow Sierra Nevada; Central Great Basin, Central Rockies, Central/Southern Plains; upstate NY
- Freezing rain possible Northern Intermountain

Major Disaster Declaration approved – Alabama

### Tornadoes – AL and GA



<u>Current Situation</u>: Search and Rescue, debris removal and damage assessments continue after multiple tornadoes touched down Sunday afternoon and evening in AL and GA. Largest tornado was an EF-4 tornado in Lee County, AL.

#### **Lifeline Impacts:**

#### Safety and Security

 GA: 22 homes destroyed; 42 homes and 11 businesses damaged (majority in Grady County)

#### Food, Water and Shelter (ARC Midnight shelter count, 6:35 a.m. EST)

- Shelters: AL: 2 open w/ 15 occupants; GA: 2 open w/ 17 occupants
- GA: Cairo Wastewater Plant experienced some structural damage, but plant is up & running

#### Health and Medical

- AL: 23 confirmed fatalities; approx. 30 people missing
- AL: All hospitals & nursing homes are operating (normal power)

#### Communications

- AL: Verizon cell tower is down in Lee County; Cellular disruptions localized, may have impact to responder communication in the area
- GA: AT&T services restored; one tower destroyed in rural area

#### **Transportation**

- AL: Multiple aircraft and hangars damaged at airport in Barbour County; several roads impassable in Lee County
- GA: roads in 3 counties have been cleared of debris and re-opened



#### **State and Local Response:**

- Major Disaster Declaration approved for Individual and Public Assistance
- AL EOC at Partial Activation; Governor extended a State of Emergency
- GA EOC at Partial Activation; Governor declaring a State of Emergency
- PDAs for 3 counties in GA to begin March 7

#### FEMA Region IV Response:

- RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
- IMAT-1 deployed to AL EOC
- LNO deployed to AL

## Declaration Approved

#### FEMA-4419-DR-AL

- Major Disaster Declaration approved March 5, 2019 for the State of Alabama
- For severe storms, straight–line winds, and tornadoes that occurred March 3, 2019
- Provides:
  - Individual and Public Assistance for debris removal and emergency protective measure (Categories A and B) for Lee County
  - Hazard Mitigation statewide










# **Precipitation Forecast**






### Fire Weather Outlook








