Flooding – Central U.S.

FEMA

Current Situation

Major to historic river flooding continues across parts of the Missouri and Mississippi River basins where heavy rainfall last week caused rapid snow melt. Ice jams and levee overtopping remain a concern. The Missouri River system is expected to reach peak flow by Tuesday. Rivers/tributaries continue to improve across the region although major to moderate flooding will continue into next week.

Lifeline Impacts

Safety and Security


- NE: 2 levee breaches near Peru in Nemaha County; waters have begun to recede around Arlington (Washington County); USACE reducing Gavins Point Dam discharge rate to lessen impacts downstream
- MO: Multiple levees in Atchison and Holt counties have been breached or overtopped
- IA: Significant damage expected to the Joe Reisner Dam in Humboldt County due to ice jams; 3 levees on Missouri River have breached

Food, Water, and Sheltering

- Mandatory and voluntary evacuations ongoing
- Shelters: NE 33 with 1,190 occupants; IA 5 with 14 occupants (Region VII SLB)
- NE: 42 wastewater treatment facilities remain non-operational

Health and Medical

- NE: One confirmed fatality
- NE: Pender Community Hospital (Thurston County) is inoperable and evacuated
- IA: Nursing home in Blackhawk County may evacuate due to rising waters



Flooding – Central U.S.

<u>Energy</u>

- NE: Cooper Nuclear Power Station remains operational
- Minimal power outages throughout impacted area
- NE: Rail coal shipments to power companies in Douglas and Otoe counties delayed 3-5 days due to rising flood waters impacting railways; both plants have 30 day coal supply on hand
- NE: Diesel fuel shortage in Fremont (Dodge County) for Highway Dept engineers

<u>Communications</u>: NE: all Verizon sites are operational and no longer on generator power

Transportation

- NE: At least 51 state highways closed; State is developing a route into Freemont
- IA: Most road closures centered around Council Bluffs, Nebraska City, and Davenport; I-29 along the MO river closed in multiple locations
- MO: I-29 closed at Rockport (Atchison County); minor roads and state highways are beginning to close


Hazardous Materials

- 42 wastewater treatment plants in NE are inoperable and discharging raw sewage into the Platte and Missouri Rivers
- NE: Multiple propane tanks loose and floating in the rivers

State / Local Response

- NE & IA EOCs at Full Activation; KS EOC at Partial Activation (day shift only); MO EOC at Partial Activation (day shift), Monitoring (night shift)
- States of emergency (or equivalent) declared:
 - KS, NE, IA, Omaha Tribe, Ponca Tribe, Winnebago Tribe, and Santee Sioux all of Nebraska, and Sac and Fox of the Mississippi of Iowa
- US&R NE-TF1 has returned to Lincoln awaiting orders
- NE National Guard supporting water rescues, evacuations, and infrastructure support





At 44 ft.: Water near the top of the federal levees on both sides of the river.





National Weather Forecast











Precipitation Forecast





6 - 10 Day Temperature Probability




6 - 10 Day Precipitation Probability




