# National Weather Forecast



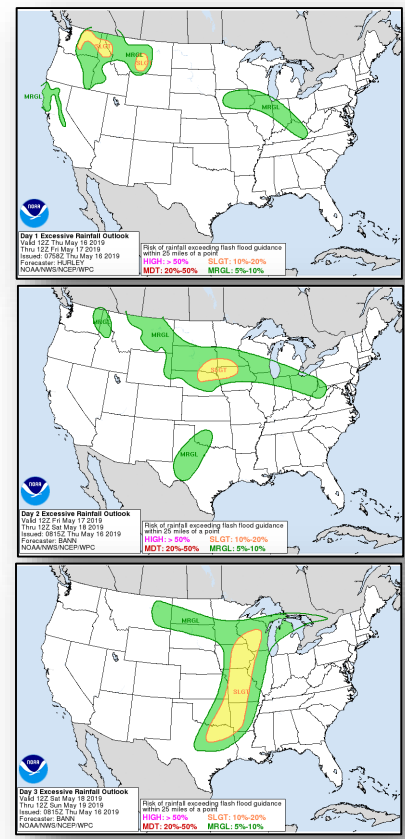
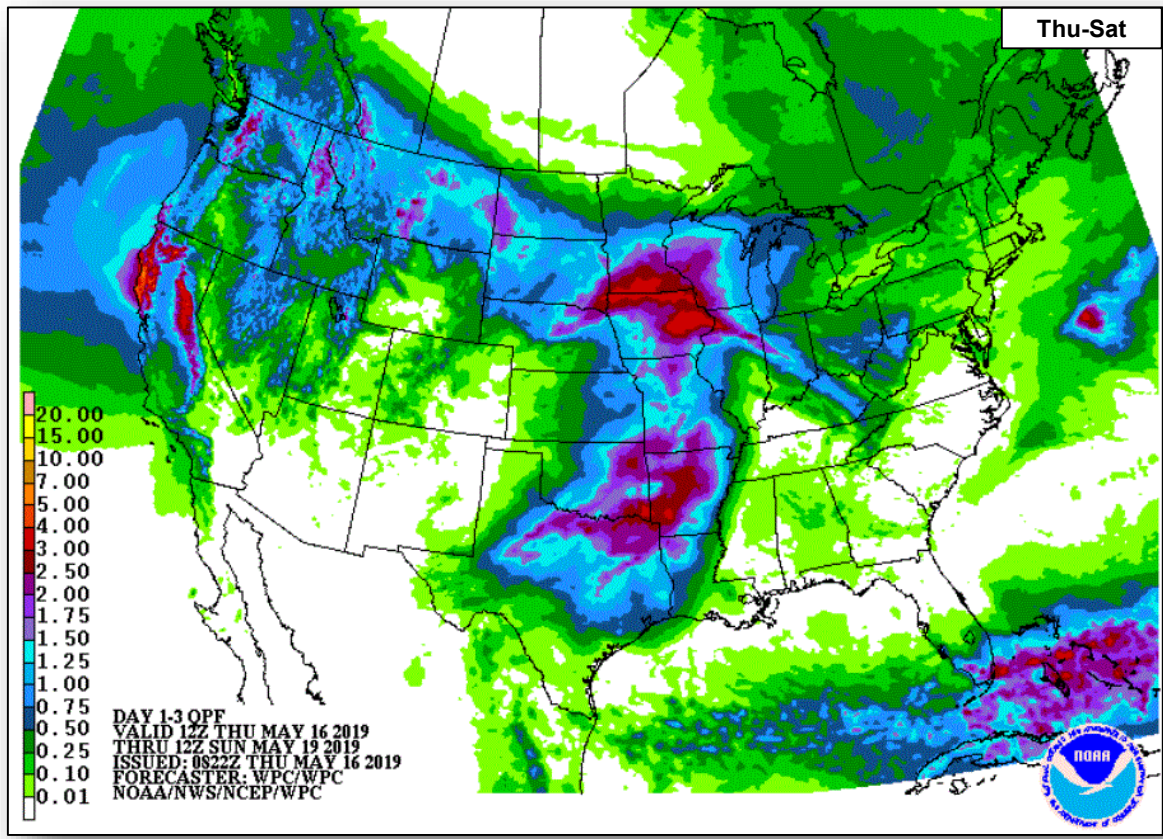

# Precipitation Forecast



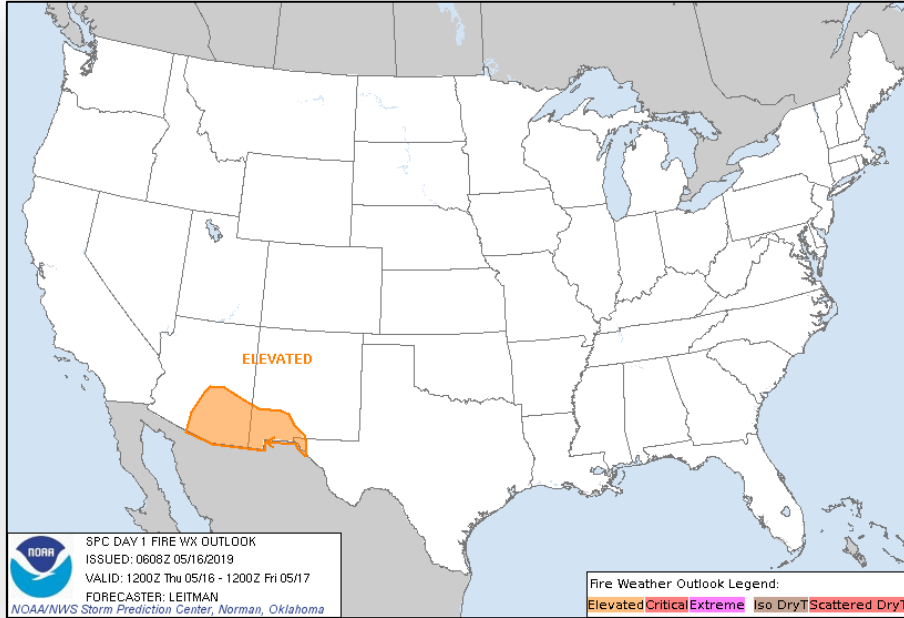

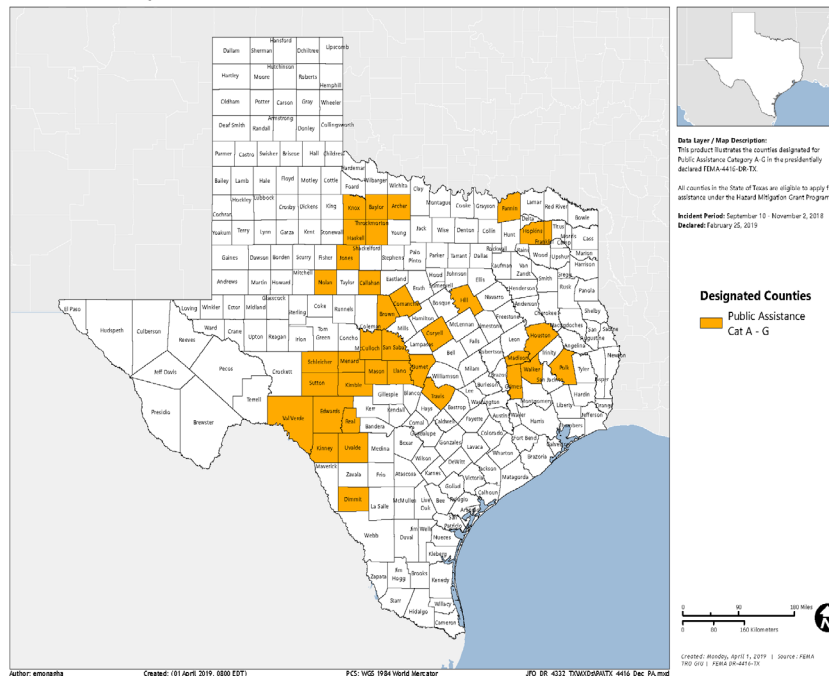
## County Designations

### Incident Overview

The President approved a presidential disaster declaration on February 25, 2019 for Public Assistance (emergency work and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities) is approved for counties of Archer, Baylor, Brown, Burnet, Callahan, Comanche, Coryell, Dimmit, Edwards, Fannin, Franklin, Grimes, Haskell, Hill, Hopkins, Houston, Jones, Kimble, Kinney, Knox, Llano, Madison, Mason, McCulloch, Menard, Nolan, Real, San Saba, Sutton, Throckmorton, Travis, Uvalde, and Val Verde. All areas of the State are eligible for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.

Major Disaster Declaration is amended to include Polk, Schleicher and Walker counties for direct Federal assistance, under the Public Assistance Program. All counties are eligible for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.

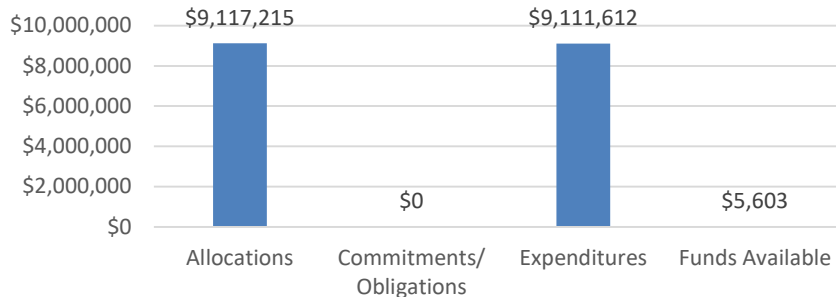

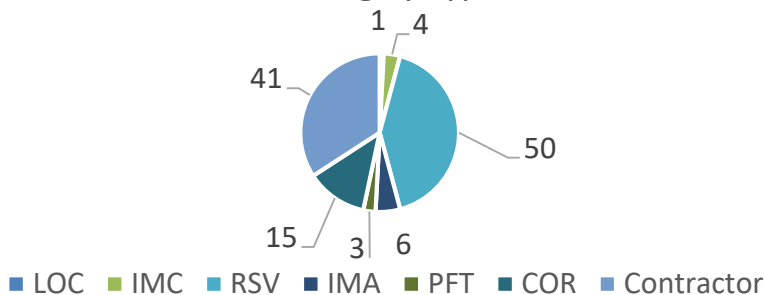

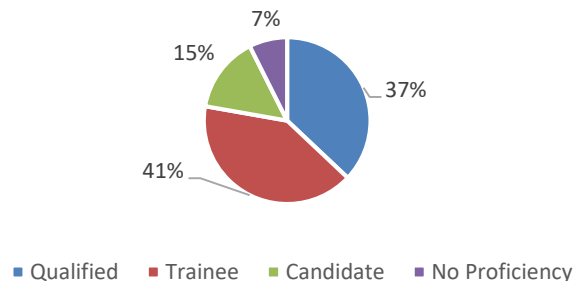
### Peak Staffing - 132

## Areas for Improvement

- Lack of qualified and available FEMA PA and EHP staff
- TAC contractor's inability to provide requested personnel, delayed operations by almost 30 days

## Strengths/Successes

- The positive relationship between FEMA, the State, and TRO, resulted in no cost, shared space for the JFO and Branch offices
- Qualified PDMGs authorized to conduct Site Inspector functions on their projects
- Use of the Road Cost Estimator Tool, a FEMA PA SME developed program
