Significant Activity – June 5-6



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Significant Events:

- Flooding – Central U.S.
- National Level Exercise 2019 – Shaken Fury

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: No activity affecting U.S. interests
- Eastern Pacific: No significant activity affecting U.S. interests
- Central Pacific: No significant activity affecting U.S. interests
- Western Pacific: No significant activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible - south-central Texas; Great Basin to the Northern Rockies and Northern Plains
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible -western and central Gulf Coast
- Elevated fire weather –MT and ND

Flooding – Central U.S.



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Current Situation:

Additional rainfall through this week will hasten ongoing major to record flooding. Major flood levels expected to continue across the Midwest and Great Lakes regions for weeks.

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security

- Levee breaches reported in IA, MO, IL, LA, and AR:
 - LA: USACE has delayed the opening of the Morganza Control Structure to June 12
 - USACE continues to monitor levees and sandbagging operations are ongoing

Food, Water & Sheltering:

- 26 shelters open with 467 occupants (*ARC Shelter report June 5*)
 - OK: 4 (-2) / 98 (+1); MO: 8 (+1) / 103 (-8); OH: 3 / 90 (-19); AR: 9 (-1) / 160 (+10); TX: 1 / 6
 - Mandatory and voluntary evacuations remain in effect in IL, OK, KS, MO, AR, and OH

Health & Medical

- OH: 1 fatality and 7 injuries
- OK: 6 fatalities and numerous injuries
- KS: 3 fatalities; 54 (+10) injuries
- MO: 9 fatalities; 20 injuries
- AR: 1 fatality

Transportation

- Roads:
 - Numerous roads remain closed; alternate routes available
- Waterways:
 - USCG closed portions of the Mississippi, Arkansas and Illinois Rivers
- Rail:
 - Amtrak, Union Pacific and BNSF services suspended in some impacted areas. Freight cargo is being rerouted.

Hazardous Materials

AR: (27) wastewater treatment plants and (16) Tier II facilities impacted. Three (3) are currently inoperable, Two (2) are threatened, and (22) remain operable. EPA is maintaining situational awareness and available as necessary. DEQ is in contact and monitoring facilities and assisting with sampling as necessary.

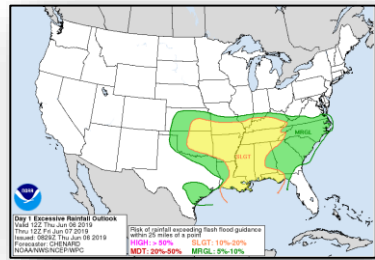
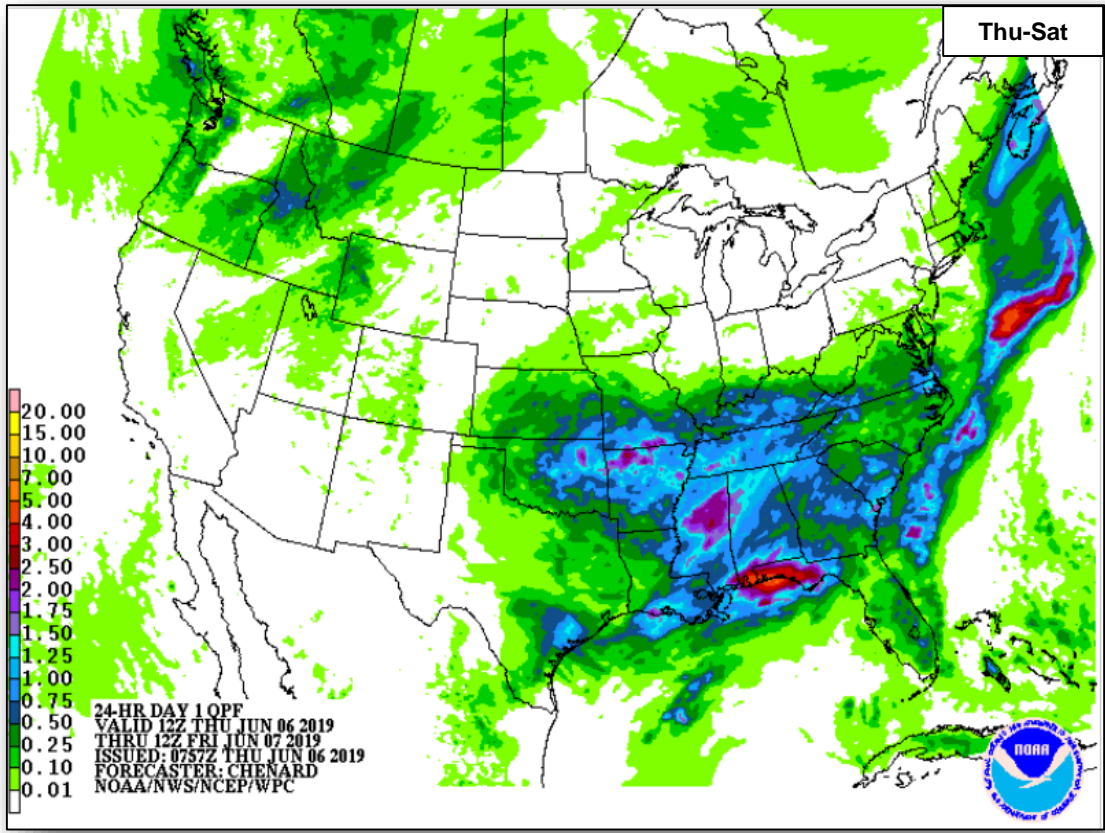
National Weather Forecast



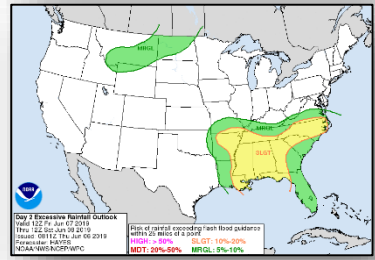
Precipitation Forecast



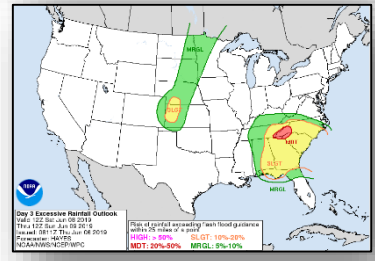

Severe Weather Outlook



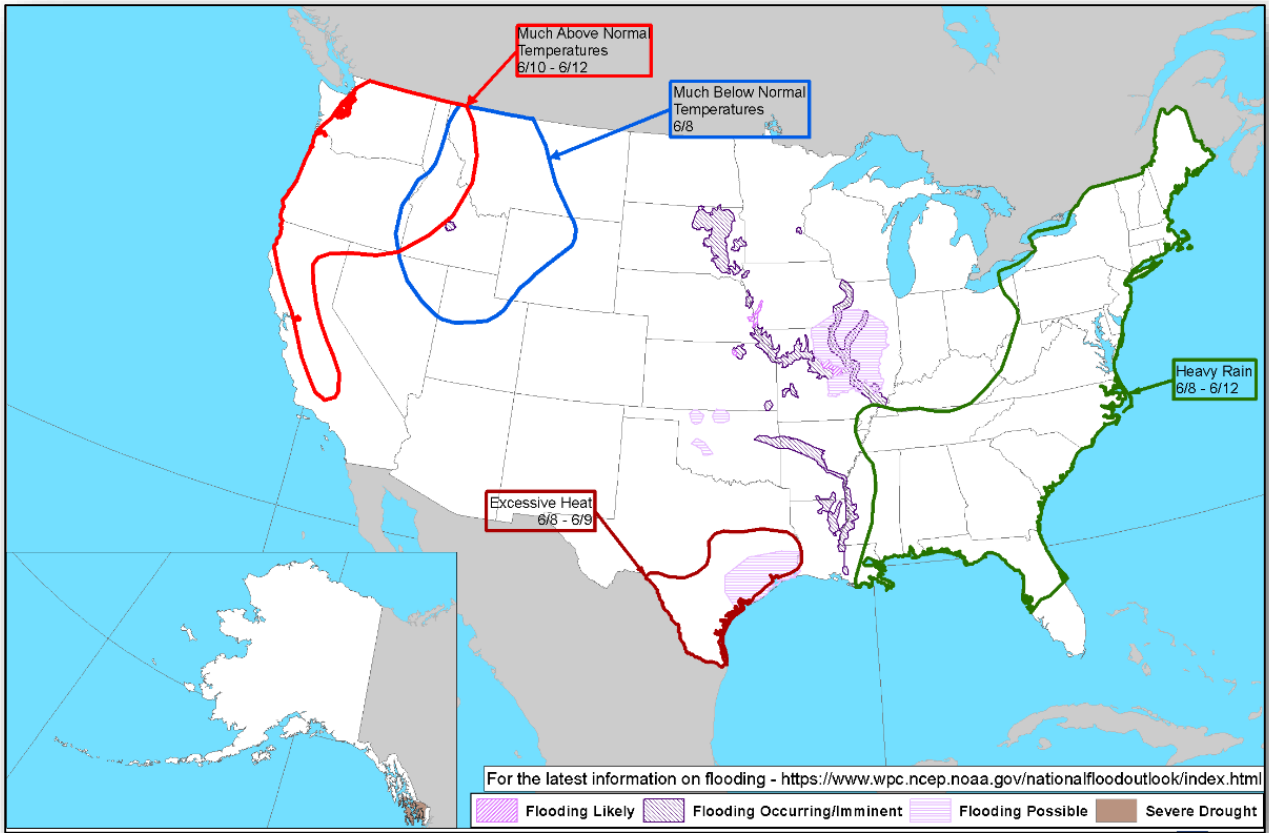
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Hazards Outlook – June 8 – 12

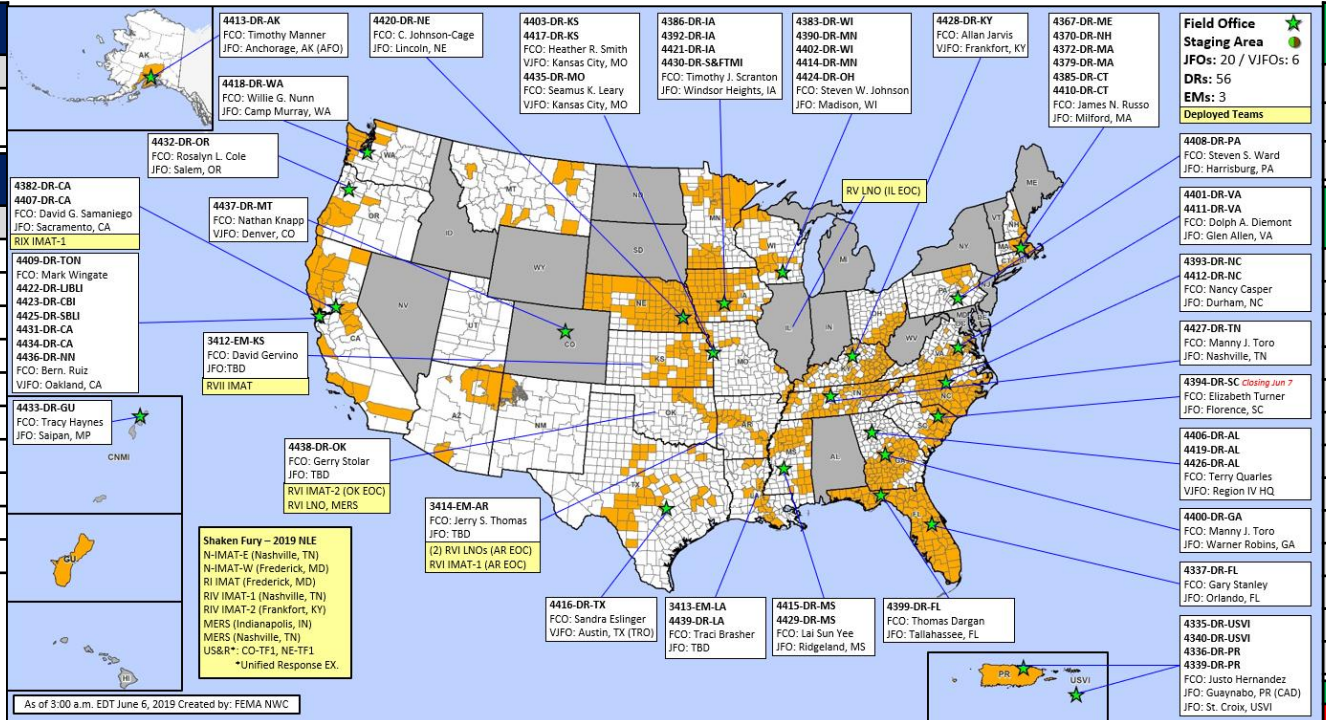

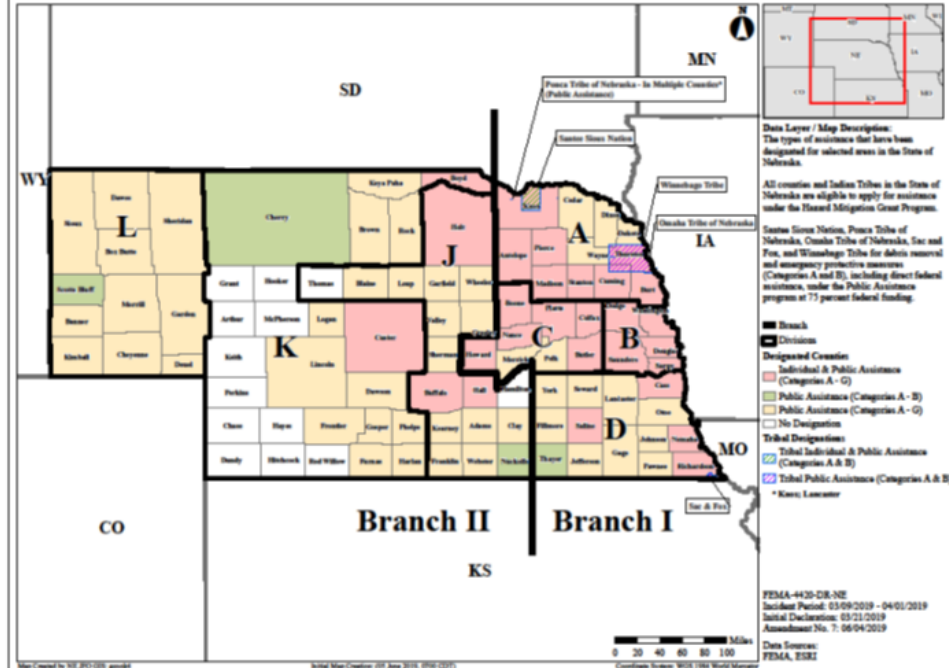
The Major Disaster Declaration on Mar. 21, 2019 designates:

- 80 counties and five tribal nations for Public Assistance
- All 93 counties and tribal nations for Hazard Mitigation statewide.

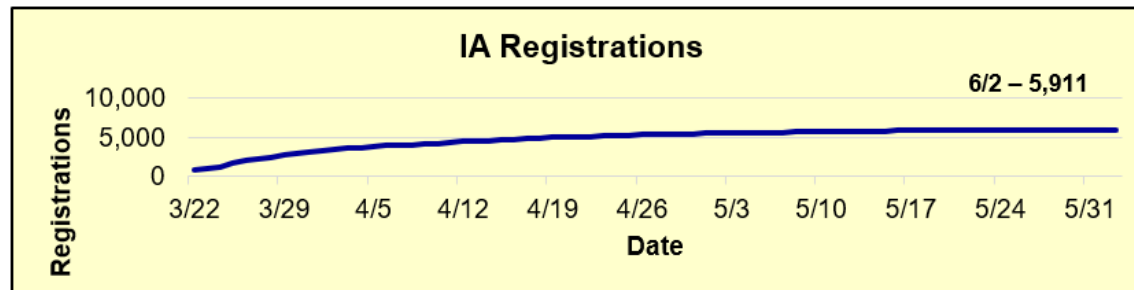
