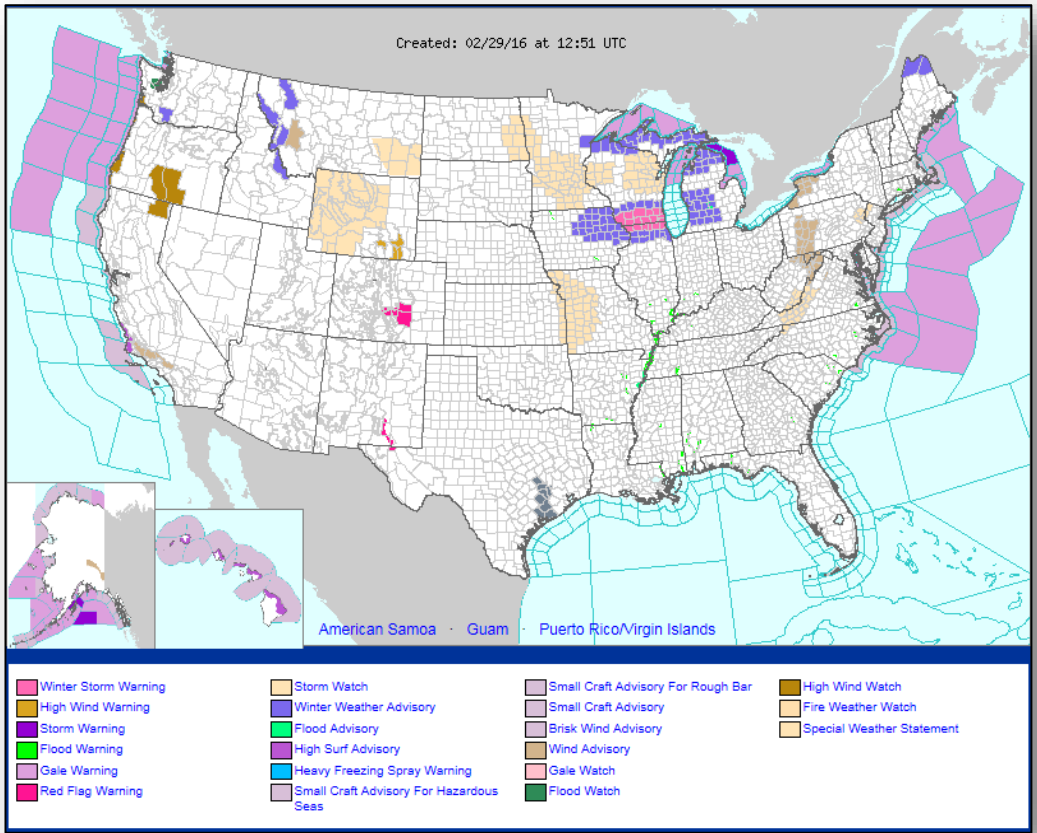

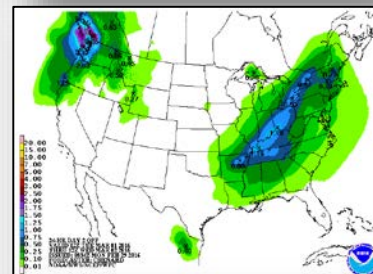
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



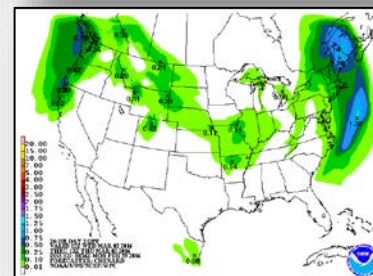

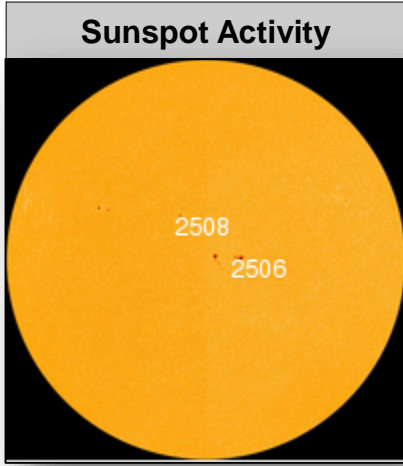
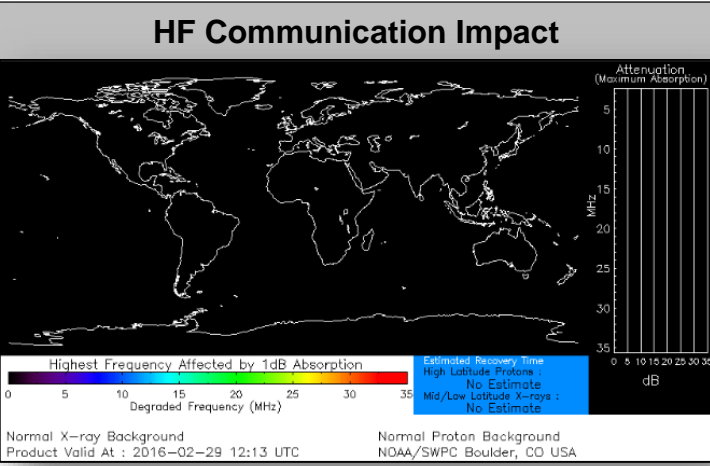
Temperature Probability

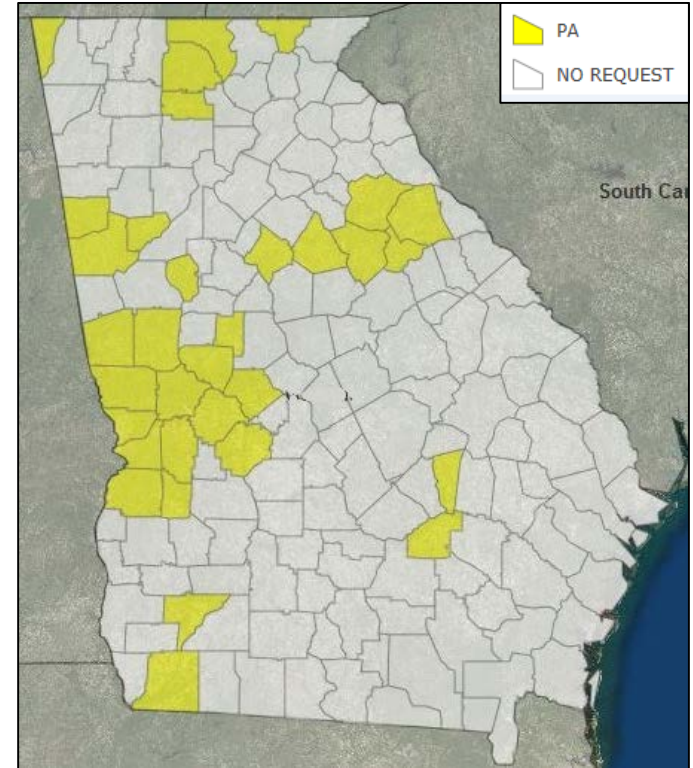

- FCO is Rosalyn L. Cole

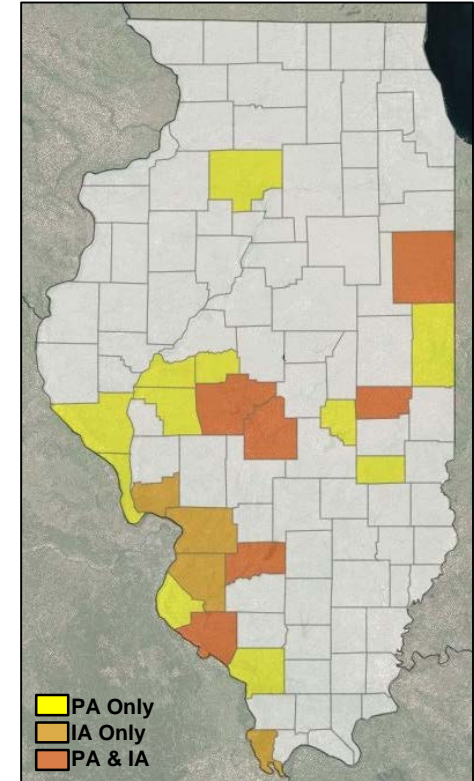

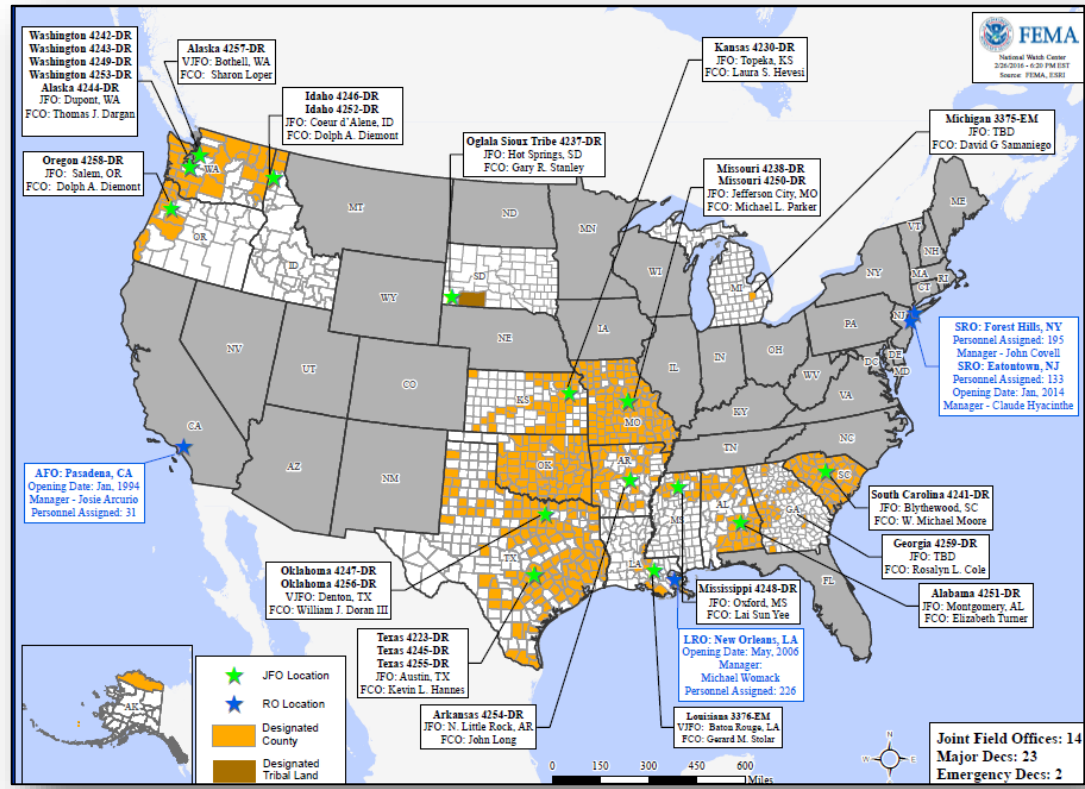
