<u>Severe Weather and Flooding – Southern Plains to Lower Mississippi Valley</u>

- Major river flooding will continue into early next week for parts of LA, especially on the Lower Sabine and Red Rivers
- Additional total rainfall amounts of 1-4 inches is expected in the coastal region through Saturday, causing a delay in the rate of recession of flood waters




National Forecast – Day 3






Snowfall Forecast






Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day






