





Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day






Fire Weather Outlook



<u> M7.8 Earthquake – Indian Ocean</u>

- On March 2, 2016, at 7:49 a.m. EST, M7.8 earthquake occurred 409 miles SW of Muara Siberut, Indonesia at a depth of 15 miles
- USGS issued Green PAGER indicating low likelihood of casualties and damage
- International agencies in the local area have issued Tsunami and Marine warnings

(Note – this is outside the Pacific Tsunami Warning Center's area of responsibility)

- Global Disaster Alert and Coordination System has indicated it is likely a tsunami was generated, but the maximum wave height is under 1 meter (See updates here: <u>http://www.gdacs.org/</u>)
- No fatalities, injuries or damage reported
- No requests for FEMA assistance


