
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



Situation Overview

Incident: Between December 6 and 23, 2015, widespread flooding, mud, land and debris slides, high winds, and snow at higher elevations damaged and destroyed homes, businesses, private non-profit facilities, productive agricultural lands, farm buildings and fences. The event caused extensive damage to public infrastructure and expenses for debris removal and emergency response.

A Major Disaster Declaration was issued on February 17, 2016 for Public Assistance (Categories A-G) for Clatsop, Columbia, Coos, Curry, Lane, Lincoln, Linn, Multnomah, Polk, Tillamook, Washington, and Yamhill Counties. Hazard Mitigation is available statewide. On March 16, 2016, Amendment #1 added Douglas County for Public Assistance (Categories A-G).


