

M6.2 – Ueki, Japan (Kumamoto Prefecture)

- Occurred at 8:26 am EDT on April 14, 2016
- Approximately 4 miles southwest of Ueki, Japan, at a depth of 6 miles
- The earthquake occurred on land; no Tsunami threat
- Over 100 aftershocks, the strongest a M6.0 at approximately 11:03 a.m. EDT
- USGS issued a PAGER alert:
 - Red Alert for economic losses, indicating extensive damage is probable
 - Yellow Alert for shaking-related fatalities, indicating some casualties possible
 - Level VIII on Modified Mercalli Scale (750k exposed to severe shaking)



- About 20 houses collapsed in/around Mashiki; search and rescue efforts ongoing








Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day












Precipitation Forecast, 4-5 Day






