
Severe weather impacted the Central/Southern Plains & Mississippi Valley with heavy rain and flooding;
37 tornadoes reported from May 26 – May 28


Impacts:

- Over 200 homes damaged, trees/power lines downed & state/county roads closed due to debris/flooding *Texas:*
- Water rescues and evacuations continue in Washington, Bastrop, Robertson & Fort Bend counties
- Precautionary, voluntary evacuations in effect for approximately 700 homes along Spring Creek & the San Jacinto River in Harris and Fort Bend counties
- 4.5 million gallons of untreated domestic wastewater released into floodwater around Still Cree
- 2 fatalities and 2 missing persons attributed to storms/flooding in Washington County
- 44k customers without power in Region VI, primarily in Montgomery County, TX (28k) (DOE Eagle-I, as of 7:51 am EDT)
- ARC/Partner shelters (Shelters / Occupants): TX (10 / 110); LA (1 / 6); MO (1 / 2) (ARC as of 6:30 am EDT)

Response:


- TX EOC at Monitoring, all other State EOCs remain at Normal Operations
- Governor of MO declared a State of Emergency

Tropical Depression Bonnie: (Advisory #7A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT May 29)

- Located 25 miles ESE of Charleston, SC
- Moving N at 9 mph; maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Tropical Storm force winds extend outward up to 45 miles from the center

Impacts


- Tropical Storm Warning has been discontinued from Edisto Beach, SC southwestward to the Savannah River
- Rainfall accumulations of 1-3 inches, maximum of 6 inches, expected from eastern SC to southeastern NC
- Storm surge of 1-2 feet is possible in the storm warning area during next high tide this afternoon
- Expected to produce life-threatening surf and rip current conditions along parts of the southeastern coast through the weekend










Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day








