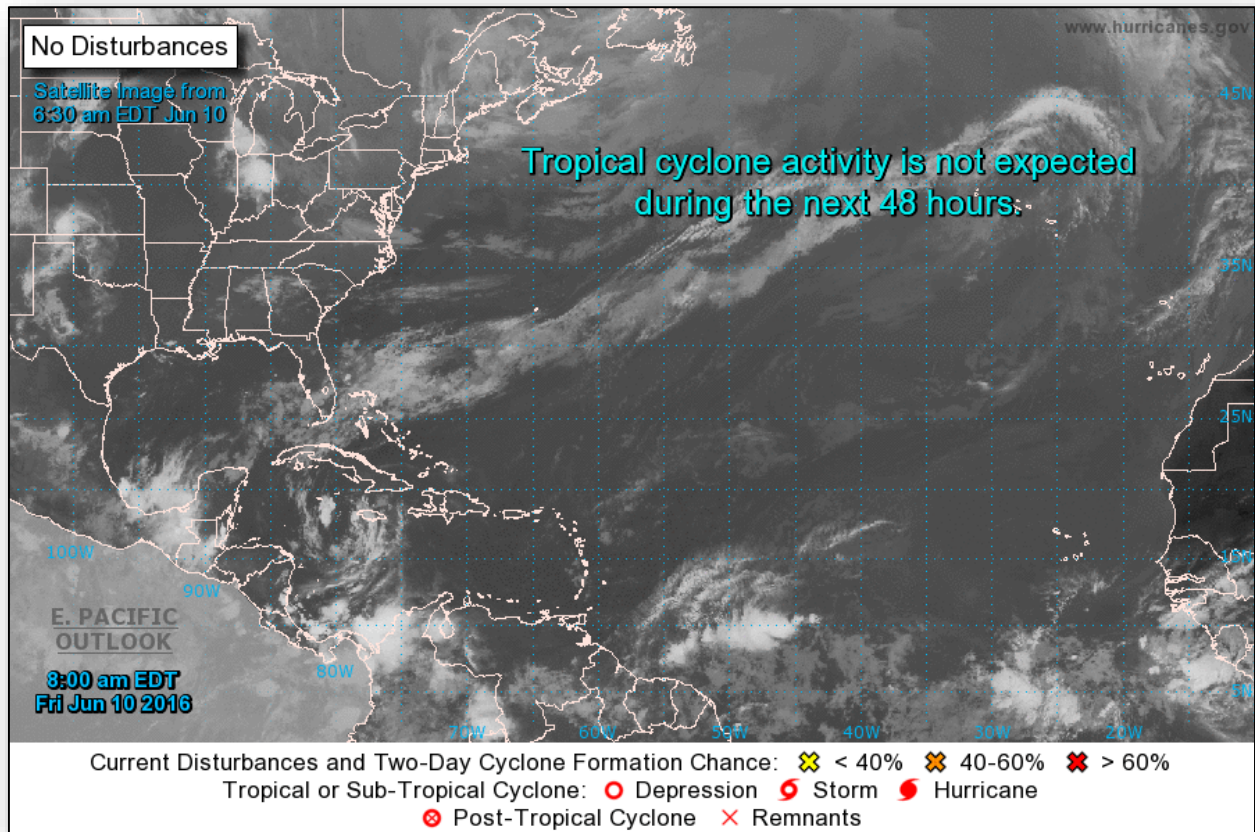
- Severe Thunderstorms – Northern Rockies & Plains, Upper Midwest to Great Lakes & Southeast

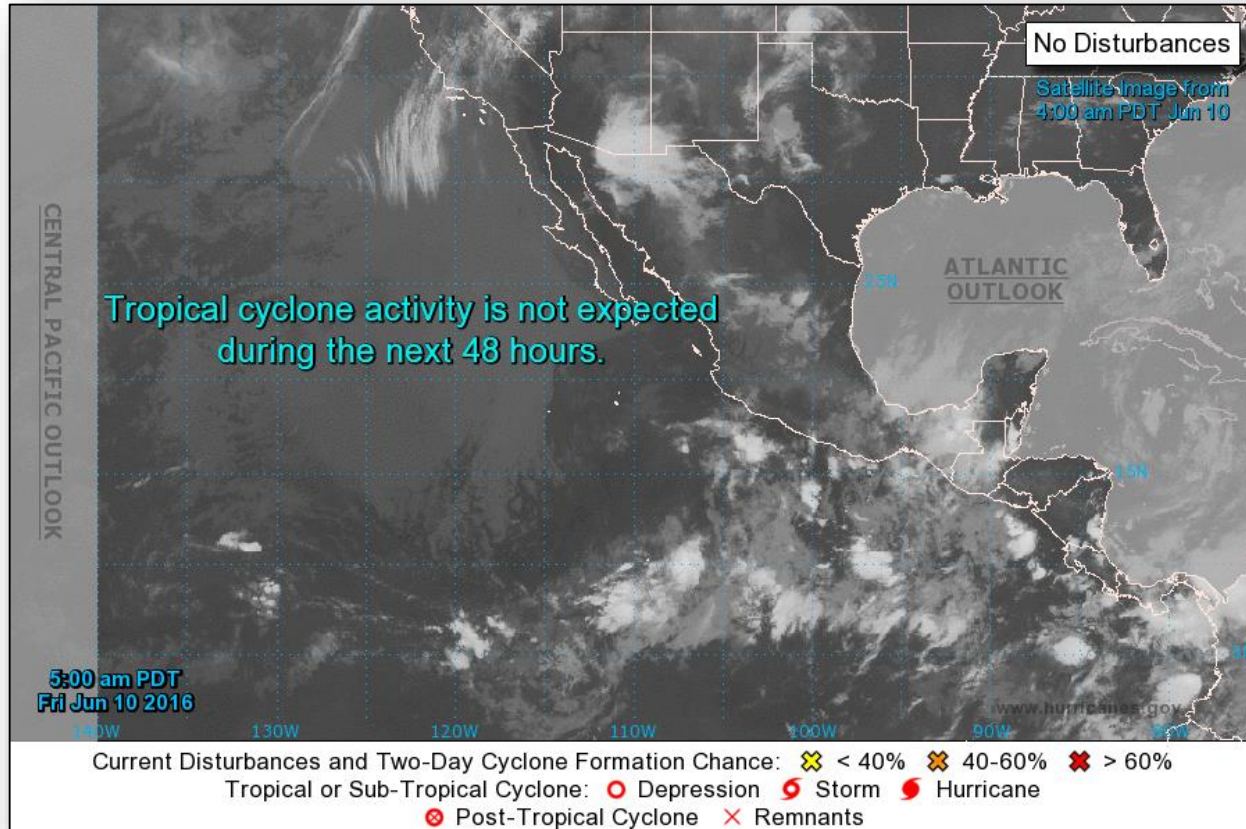

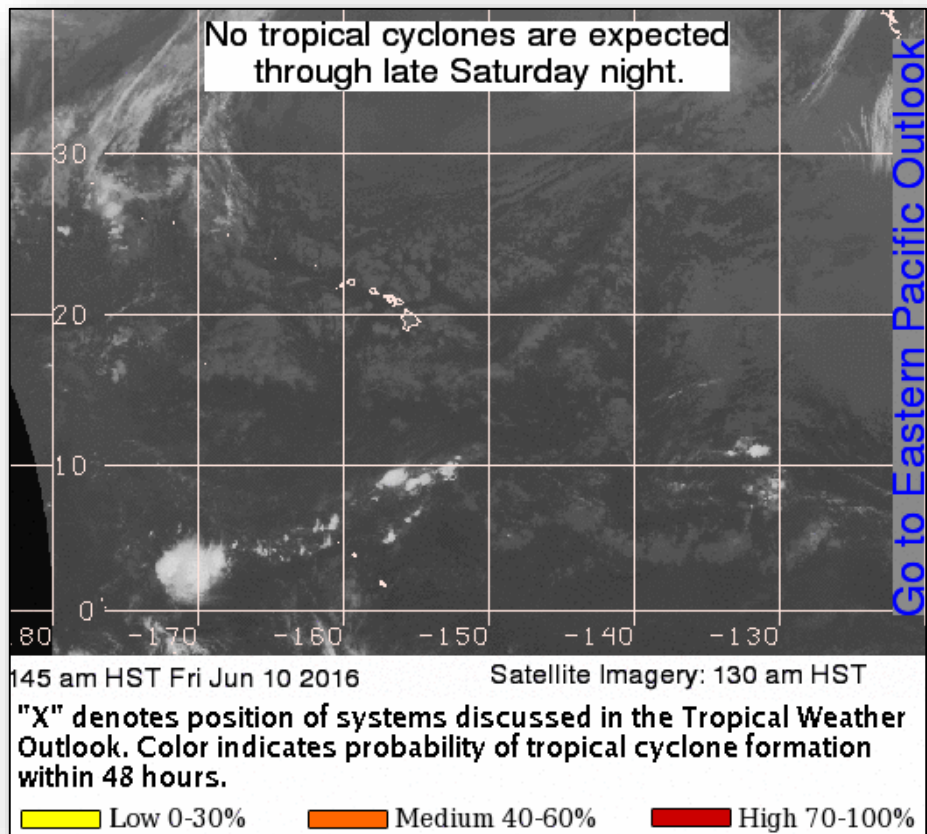

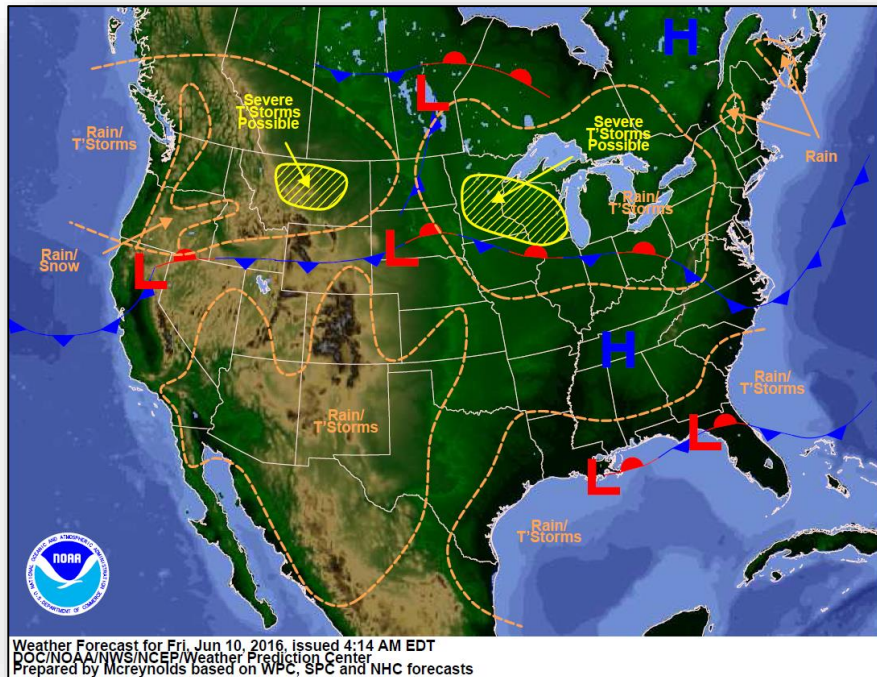
Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



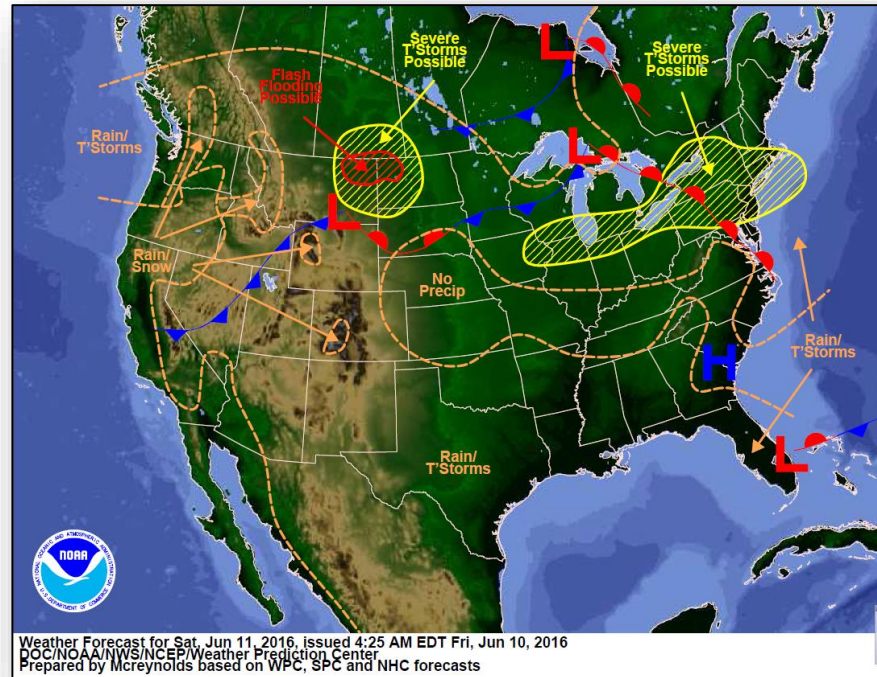

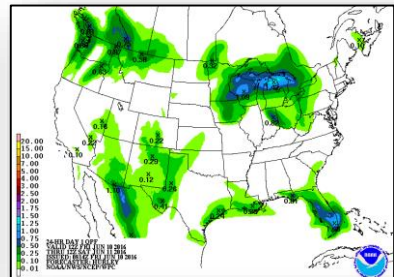
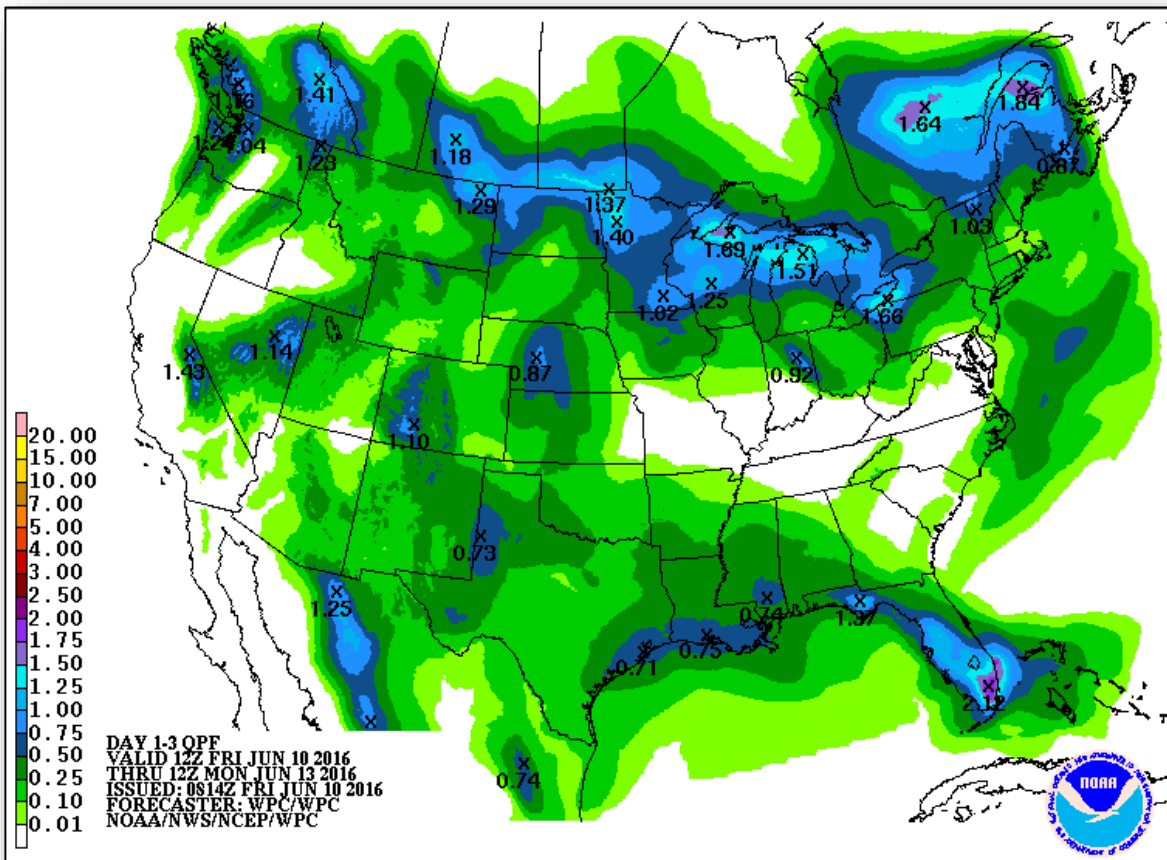


Severe Weather Outlook: Days 1-3

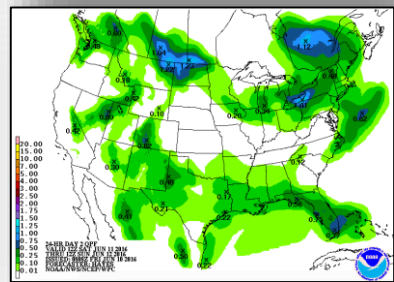




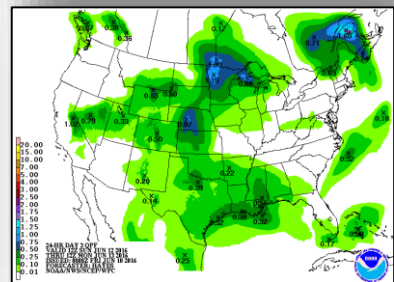
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day
