







#### Severe Weather Outlook – SPC Day 2

- Mandatory evacuation for 1,200 people; voluntary evacuations for 600 people
- Fire burning away from homes however, wind shift expected over next 24-hours
- Reservoir Fire is burning less than a mile away 1,500 acres on federal land may become a complex fire
- 5 large fires burning in the state
- CA EOC remains at Partial Activation (drought)


#### NPSC Call Forecasting and Actual Calls Over the Past 4 Weeks 05/22/2016 through 06/18/2016
