Significant Weather:

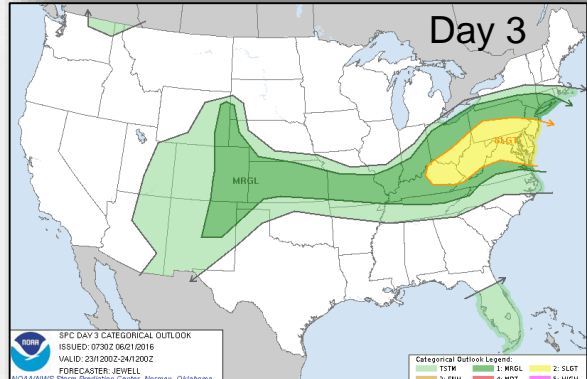
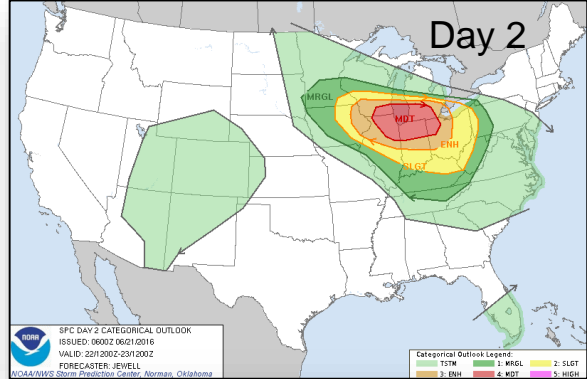
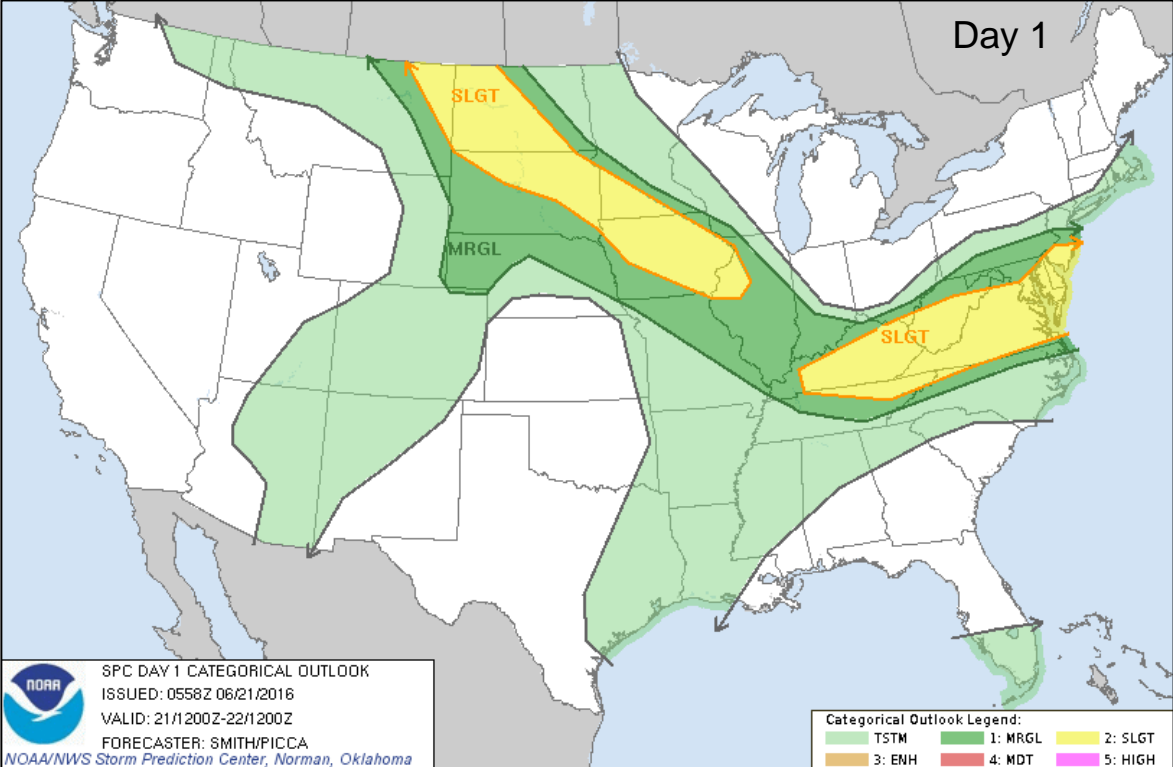

Severe Weather Outlook: Days 1-3



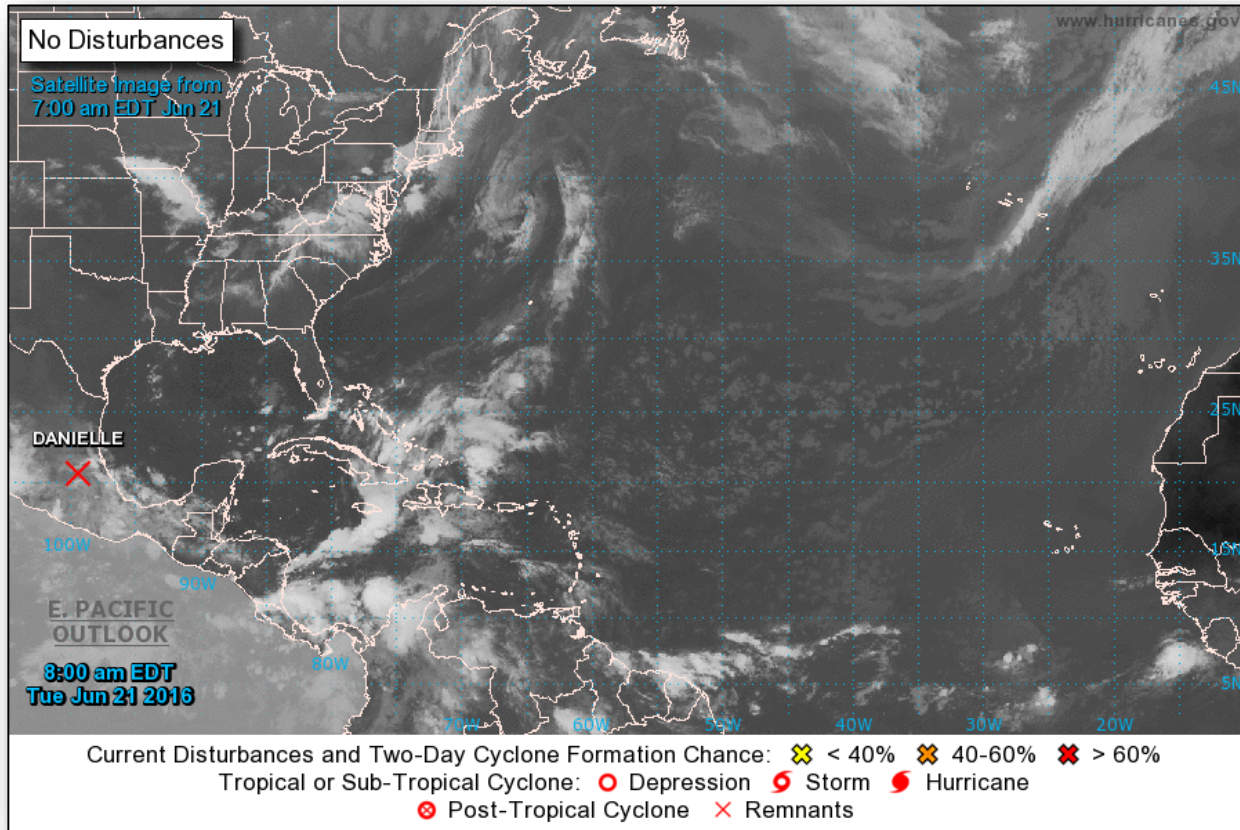
Severe Weather Outlook – SPC Day 2



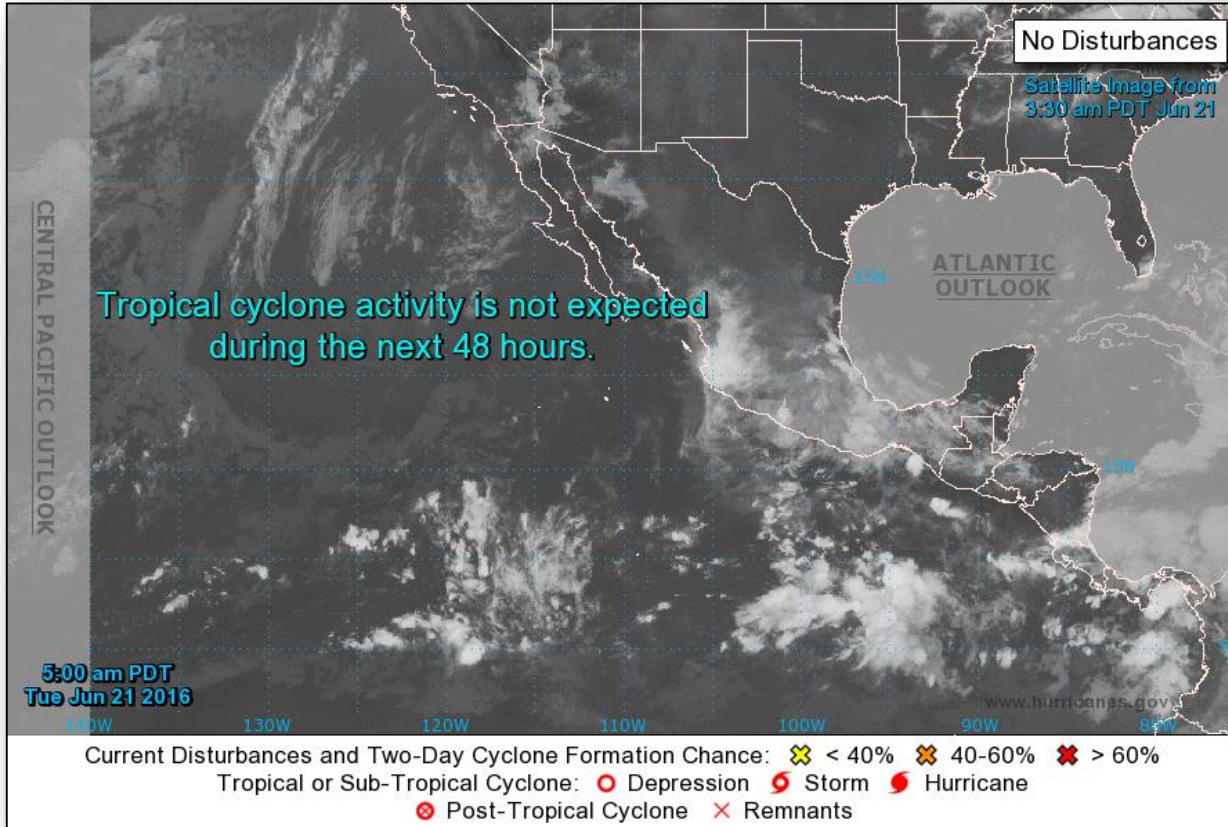

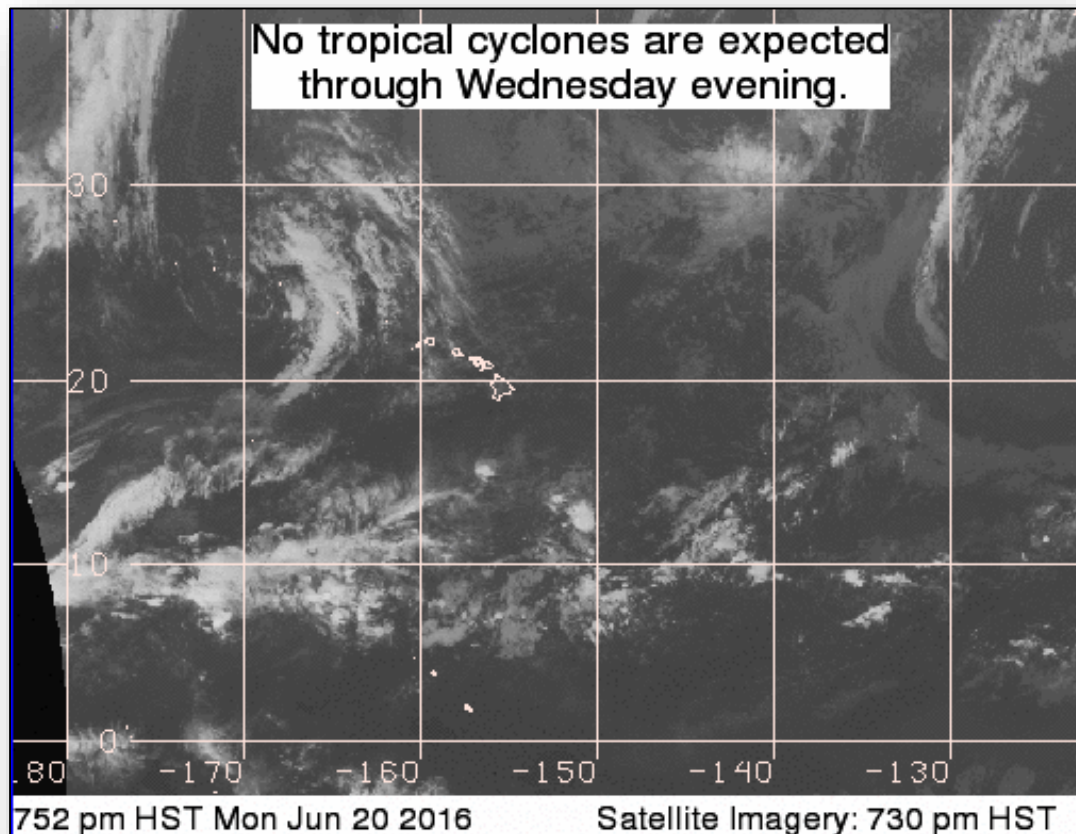
Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



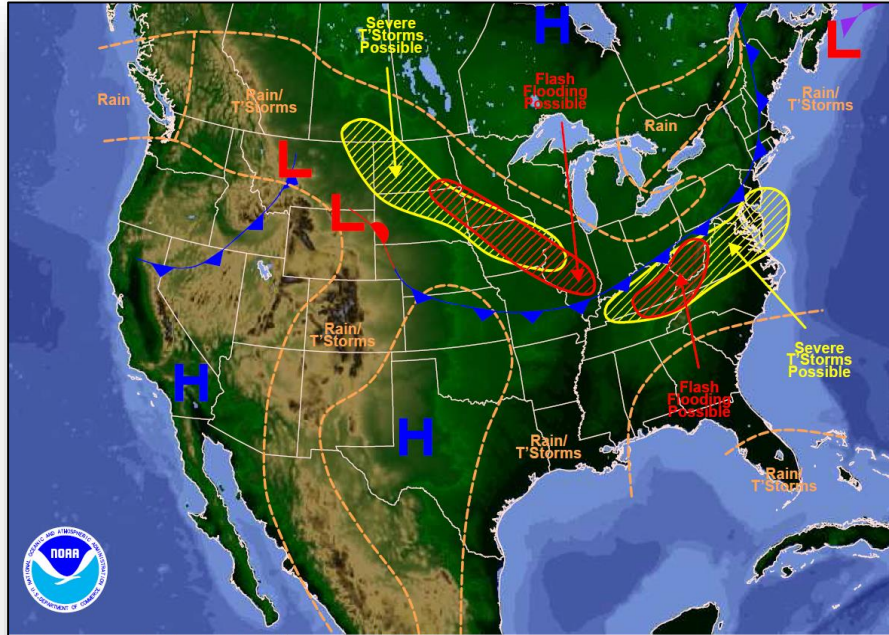
Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific

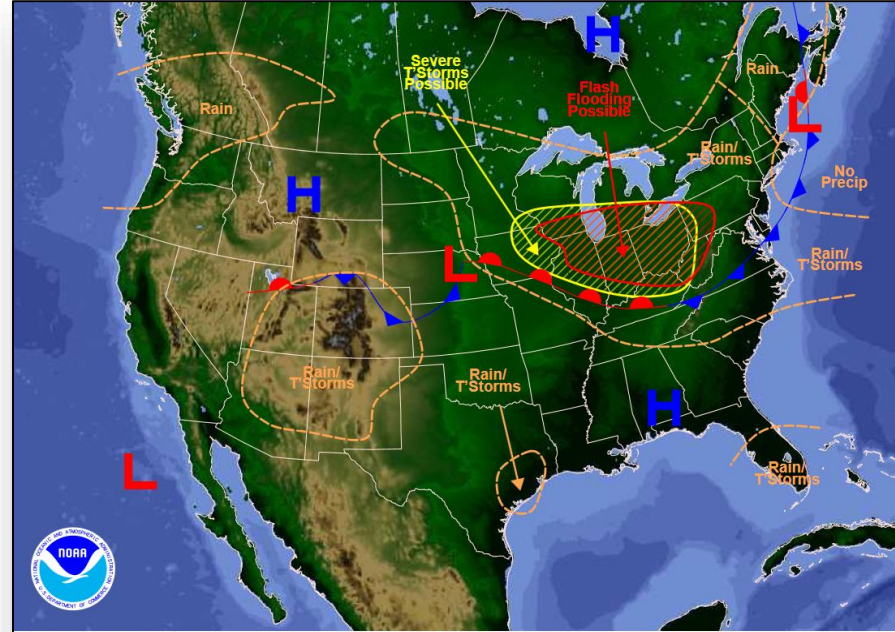

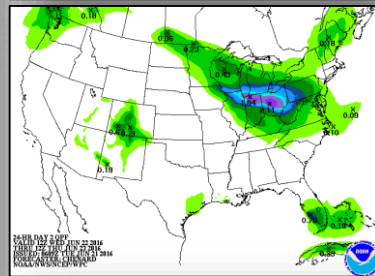
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



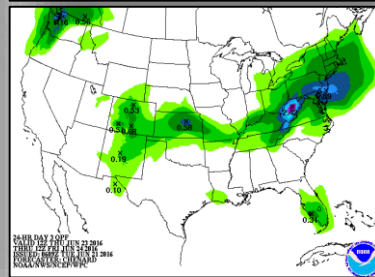

Current Situation

- Fire began on June 20 in Los Angeles County, CA
- Fire threatens:
 - 525 homes (all primary residences)
 - 3 sets of 220 kV lines & 2.5 million gallon water storage/distribution tank
- Mandatory evacuation for 1,200 people; voluntary evacuations for 600 people
- Fire burning away from homes however, wind shift expected over next 24-hours
- Reservoir Fire is burning less than a mile away – 1,500 acres on federal land may become a complex fire
- 5 large fires burning in the state
- CA EOC remains at Partial Activation (drought)

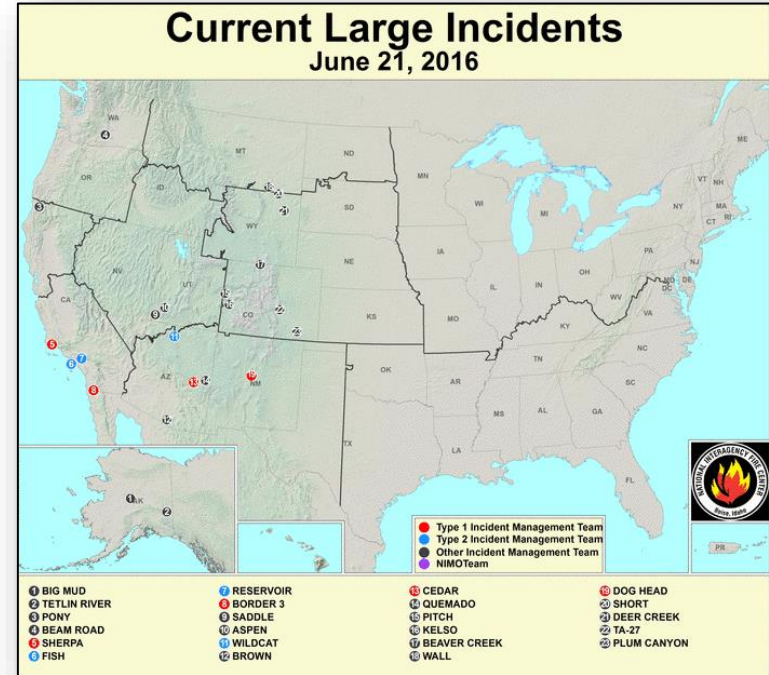

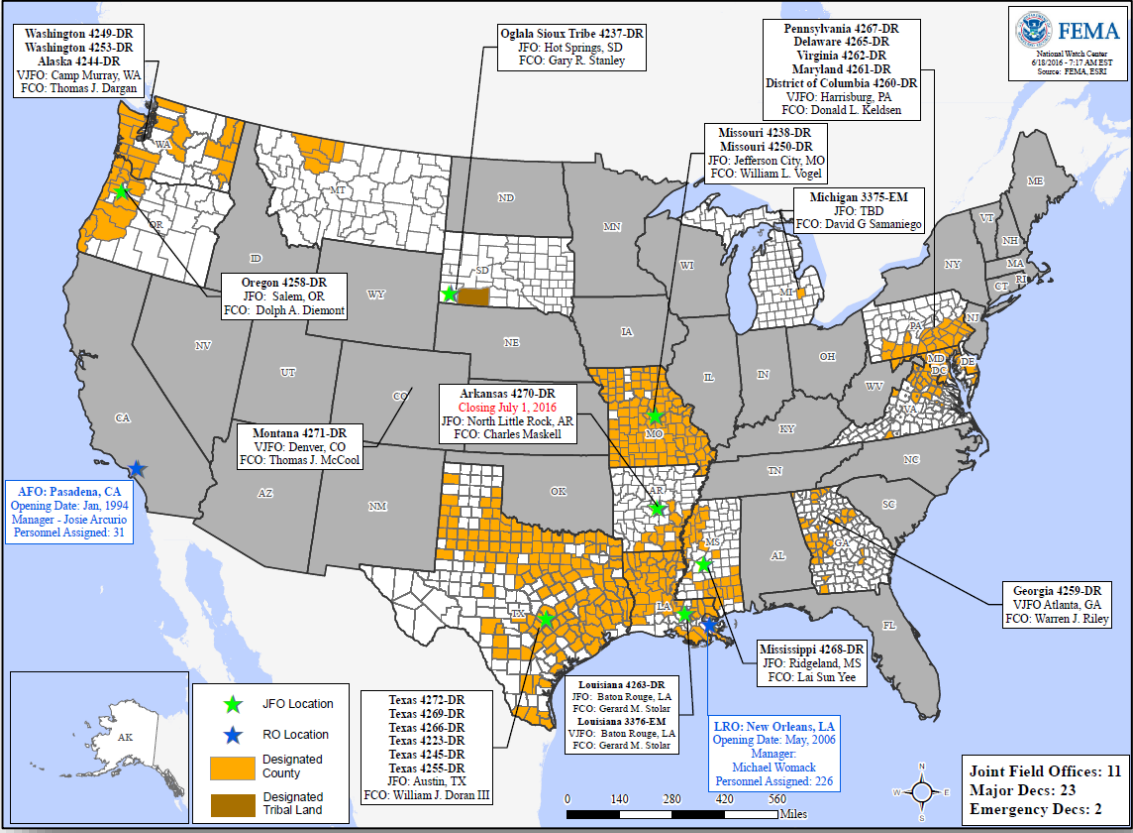

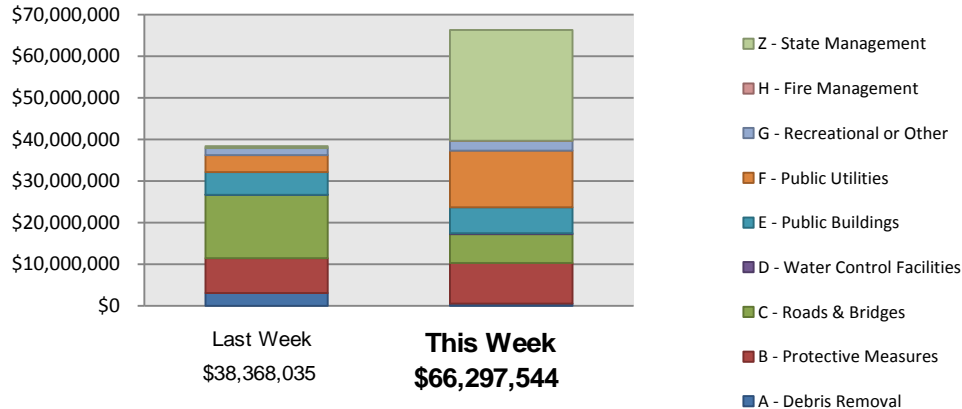

Public Assistance Obligated per Category In the Past 2 Weeks – 06/06/2016 through 06/20/2016



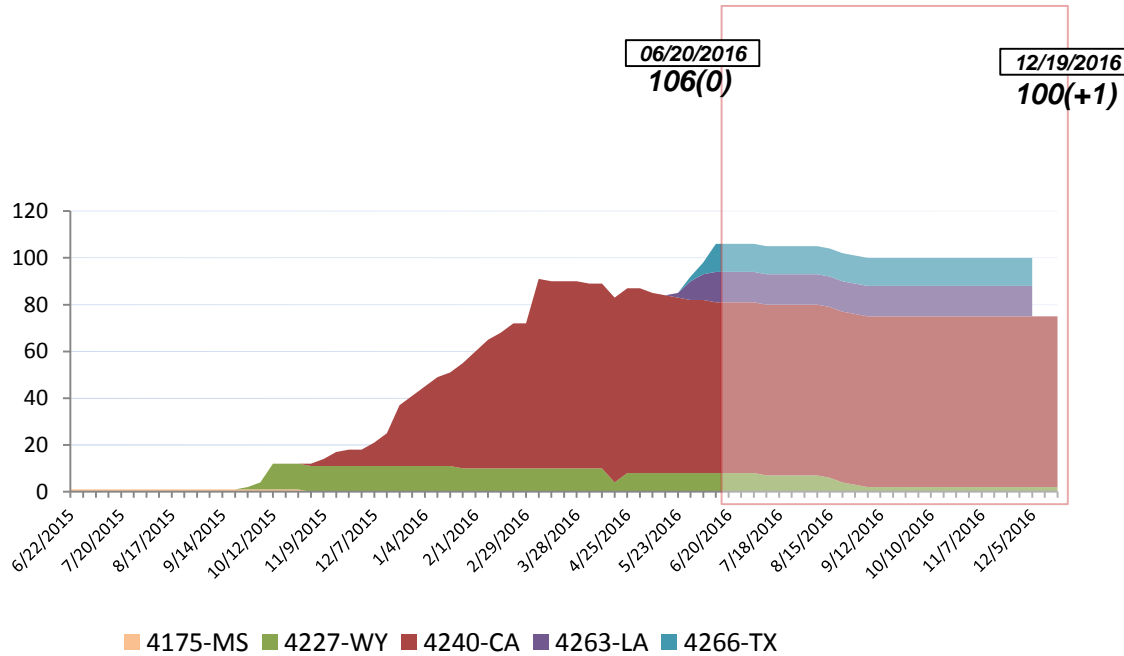

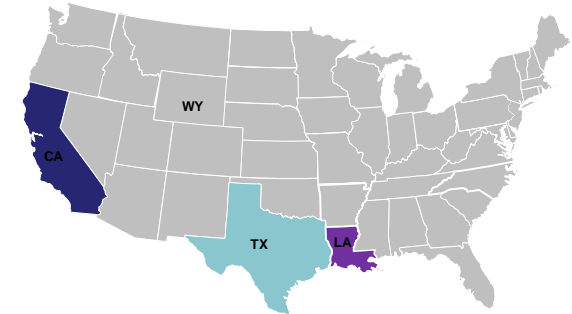

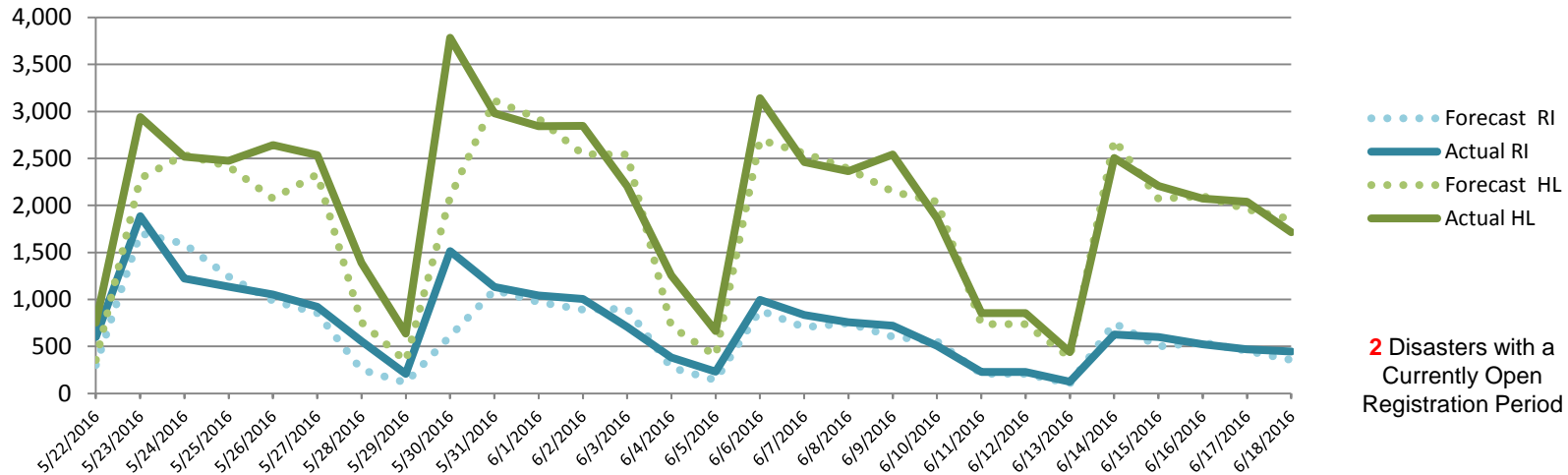

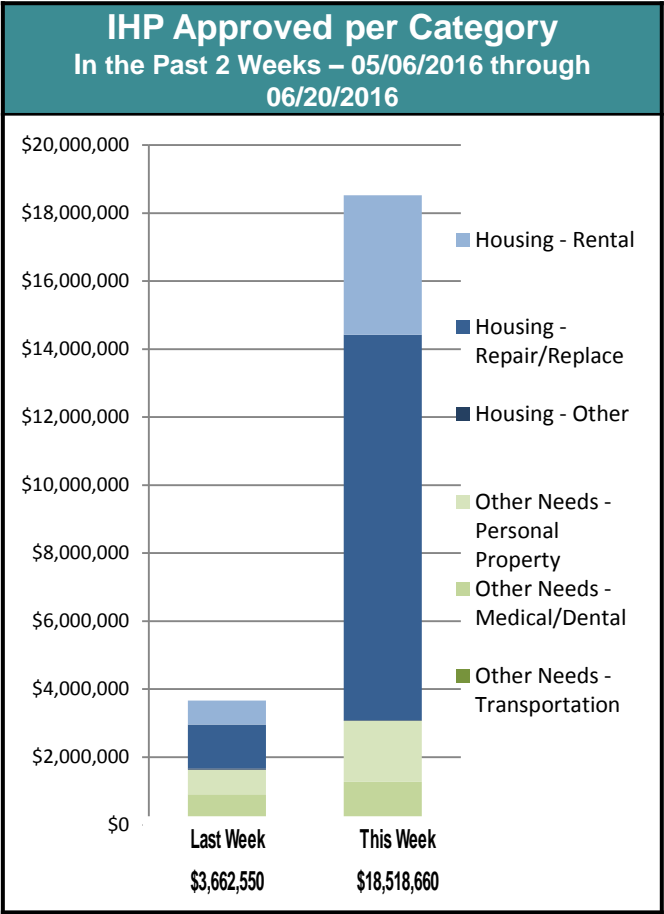
NPSC Call Forecasting and Actual Calls Over the Past 4 Weeks 05/22/2016 through 06/18/2016
