 Severe storms on June 22 brought torrential rains, tornadoes, high winds, and large hail across FEMA Region III. Flash flooding and flooding occurred across West Virginia and Virginia.

Severe Weather Outlook: Day 1 - 3




Categorical Outlook Legend: TSTM 1: MRGL






Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day


Tropical Outlook – Atlantic





Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific






NPSC Call Forecasting and Actual Calls Over the Past 4 Weeks 05/29/2016 through 06/25/2016
