Significant Activity: June 27-28



Significant Events:

- Severe Weather / Flooding in WV & VA

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical cyclone activity not expected during the next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Disturbance 1 (Low 0%)
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected through Wednesday night

Significant Weather:

- Severe Thunderstorms – Central Plains & Northeast
- Flash Flooding – Central Plains & Northeast
- Rain / thunderstorms – Southwest to Central Rockies & Plains, Lower/Middle Mississippi valleys to the Great Lakes, Ohio/Tennessee valleys to the Southeast
- Isolated Dry Thunderstorms – Central Great Basin
- Critical/Elevated Fire Weather conditions – None
- Red Flag Warnings – None
- Space Weather – No space weather storms observed in the past 24 hours, none predicted in the next 24 hours

Earthquake Activity: No significant activity

Wildfire Activity:

- **CA:** Erskine Fire (FEMA-5131-FM-CA)
- **UT:** Saddle Fire (FEMA-5130-FM-UT)

Severe Weather/Flooding – WV & VA



Current Situation:

- Severe storms on June 22 brought torrential rains, tornadoes, high winds, and large hail across FEMA Region III. Flash flooding and flooding occurred across West Virginia and Virginia.

High Level Impacts

- 23 (-2) confirmed Fatalities
- Additional damage overnight: 2 dozen homes, 2 churches and the Mud River Fire Department
- 9k customers without power (down from 24hr max of 12K) (DOE Eagle-I as of 7:30 a.m. EDT)
- 3,500 customers without water in 2 counties; 1,680 customers without gas in 2 counties
- Approximately 500 homes damaged/destroyed in Roane County, WV (pop. 14,656)
- Approximately 11 (-6) shelters with 189 (-224) occupants (ARC midnight shelter count as of 6:19 am EDT June 28)

FEMA Response:

- Major Disaster Declaration FEMA-4273-DR-WV approved on June 25
 - Provides IA for 3 counties; Emergency Protective Measures (CAT B) for 3 counties
 - FCO is Albert Lewis
- Joint IA PDA's for 10 counties ongoing; PA PDA's for 11 counties scheduled to begin today
- FEMA Region III RRCC not activated; RWC remains at Watch/Steady State
- FEMA Region I, III and IV IMAT deployed
- MERS personnel and equipment deployed from Fredrick and Thomasville
- ISB team deploying to Yeager Field; IOF established in Charleston, WV
- Federal Staging Area – Charleston, WV
 - 109K meals & 145K liters of water delivered to WV on time, June 26/27
 - FEMA Federal Staging Area Team and support package arrived June 26
 - Preparing additional shipments for arrival this week
 - 126K meals
 - 216K liters of water

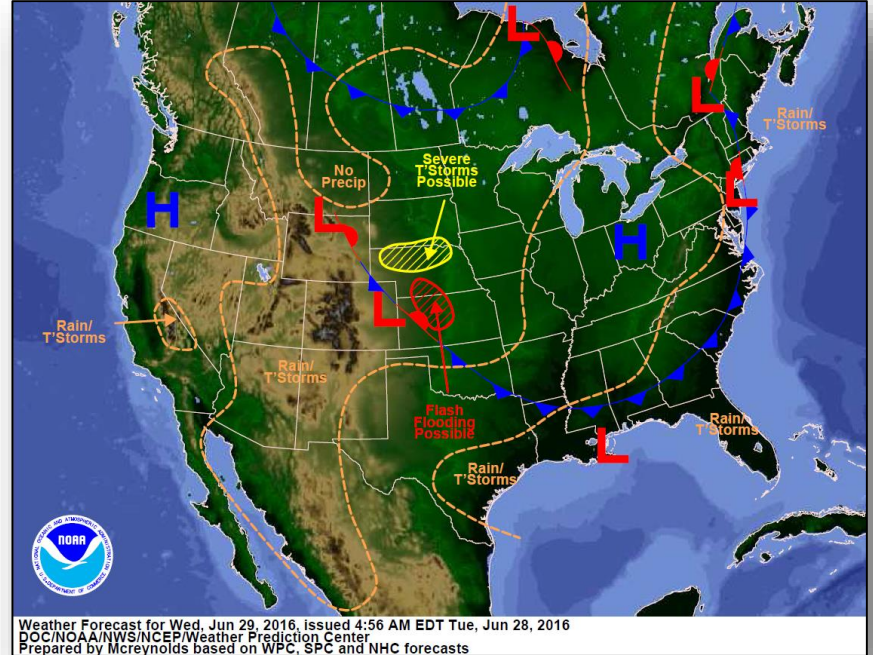

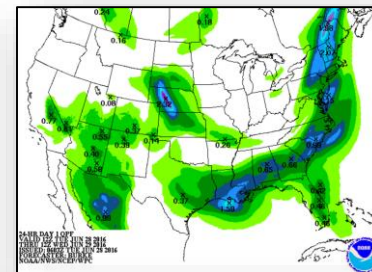
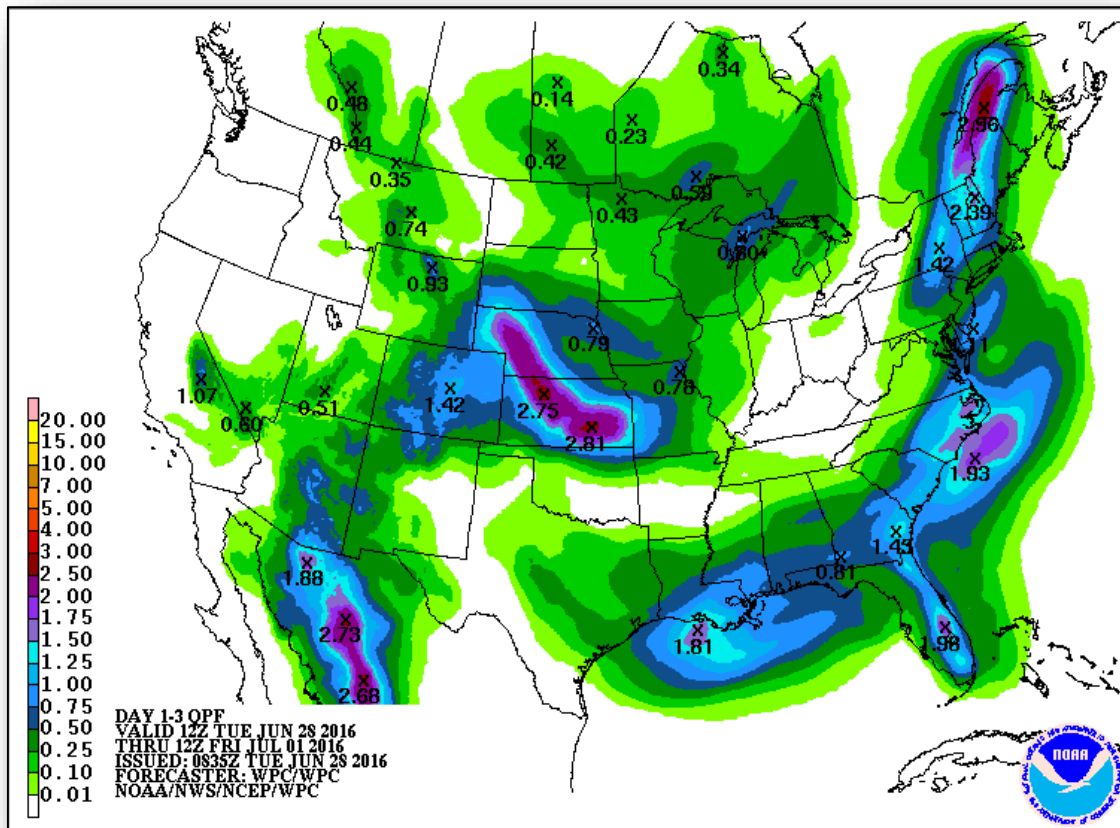
Severe Weather Outlook: Day 1 - 3



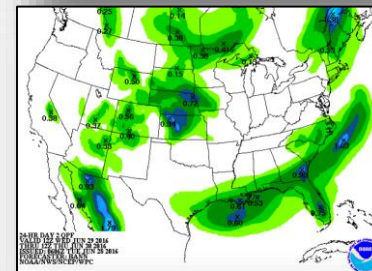
Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



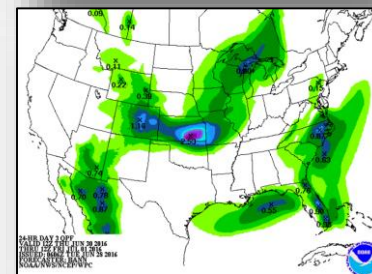

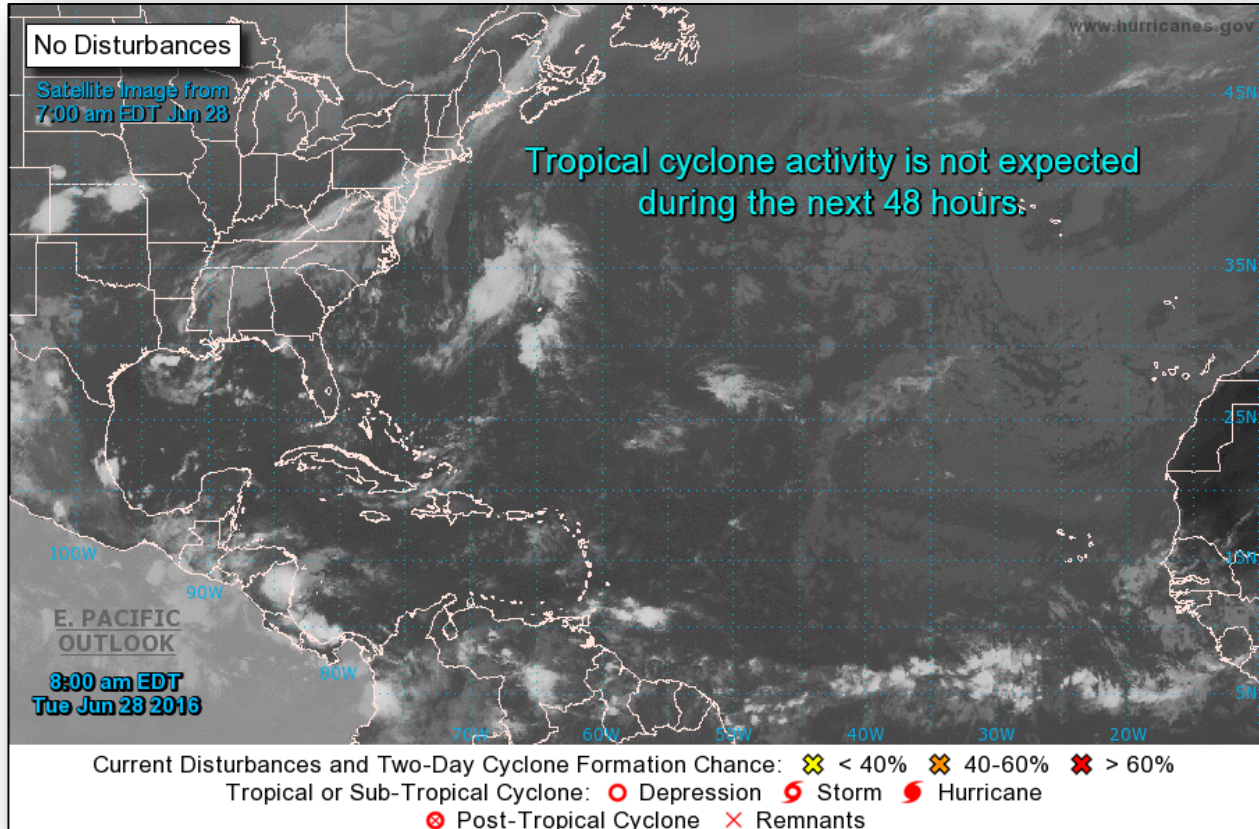

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



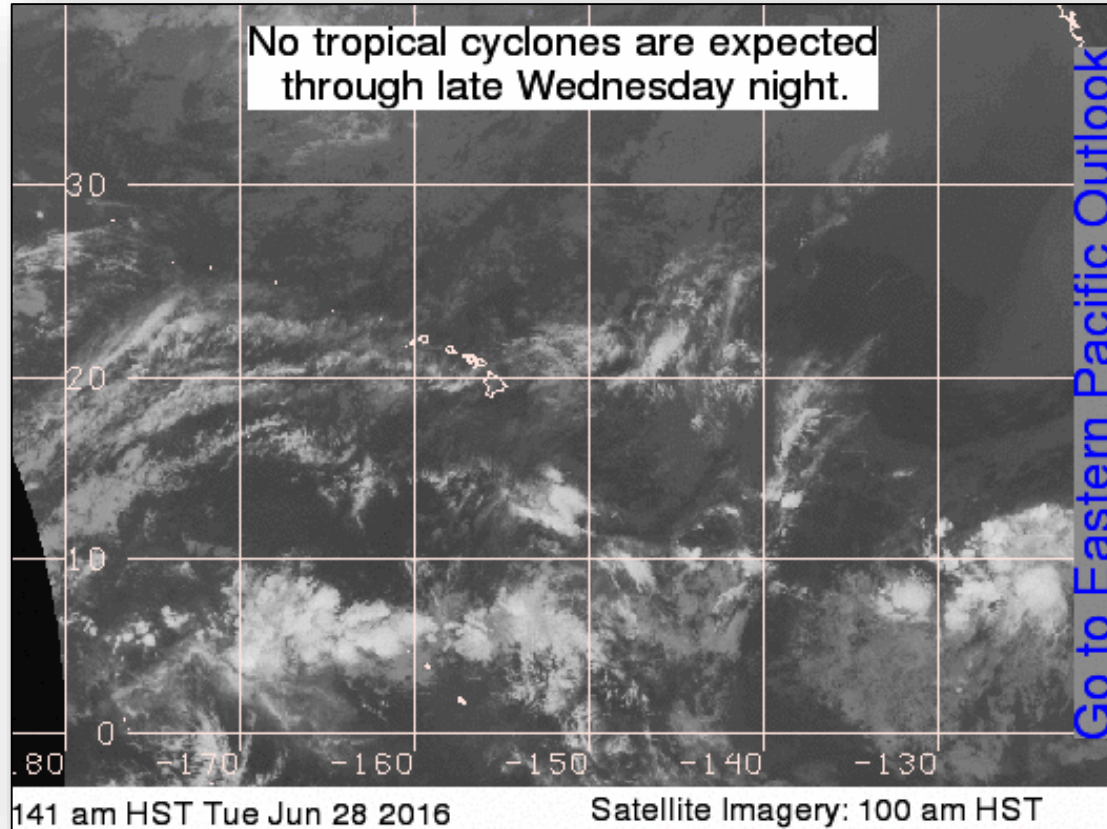
Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1: (As of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- A tropical wave located over Central America
- Moving westward into the North Pacific at 10 to 15 mph
- Will induce a broad area of low pressure south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec by Wednesday or Thursday
- Conducive for gradual development late in the week
- Formation chance through 48 hours...low...near 0 percent
- Formation chance through 5 days...low...20 percent

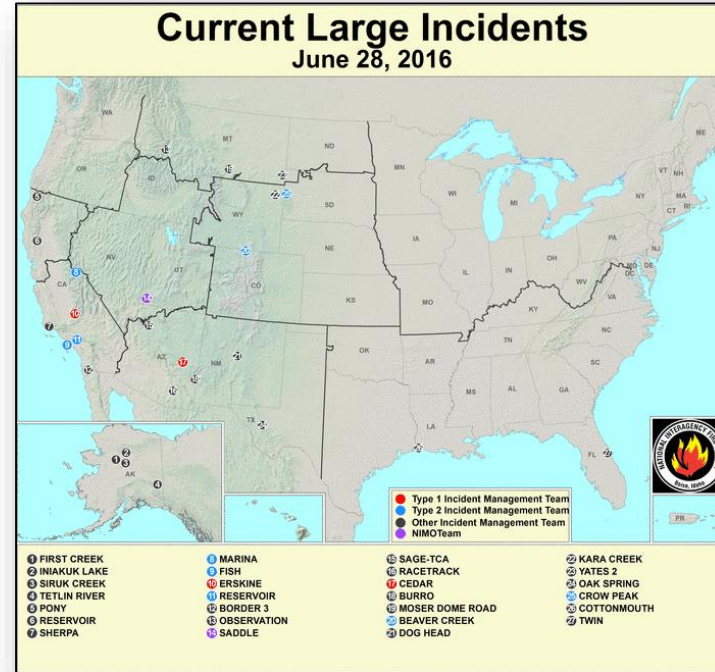

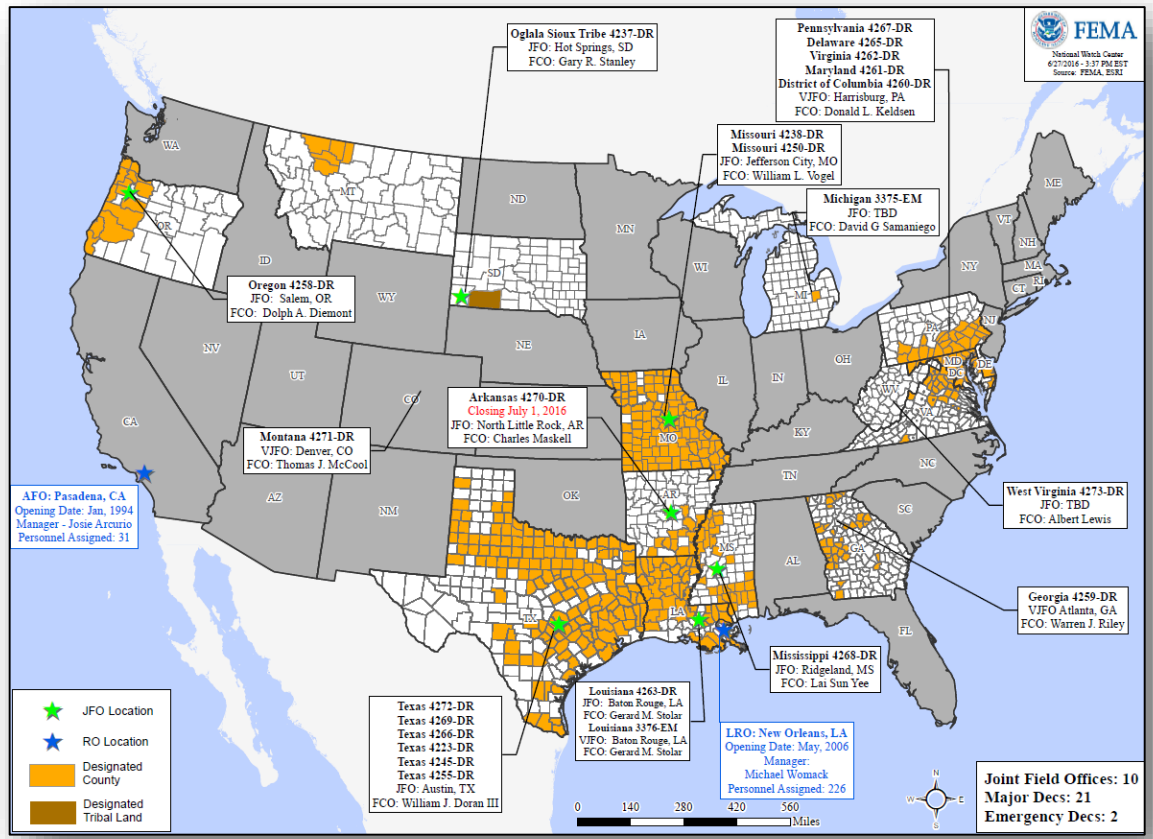

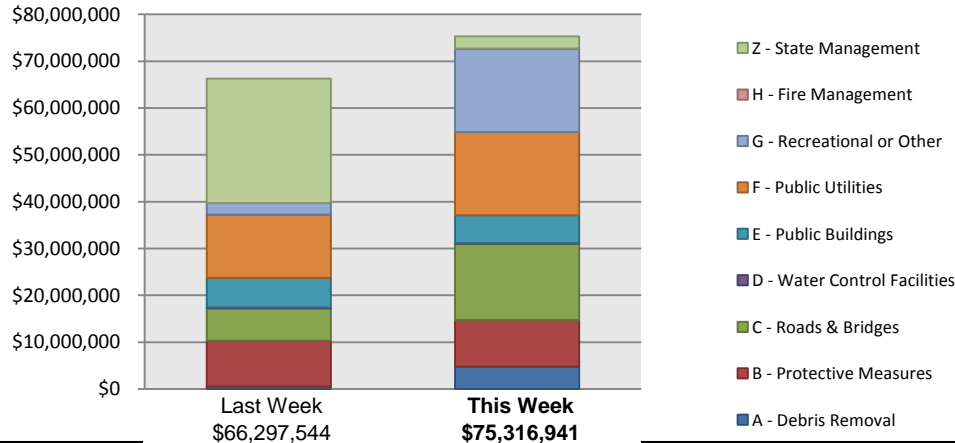

Public Assistance Obligated per Category In the Past 2 Weeks – 06/13/2016 through 06/27/2016



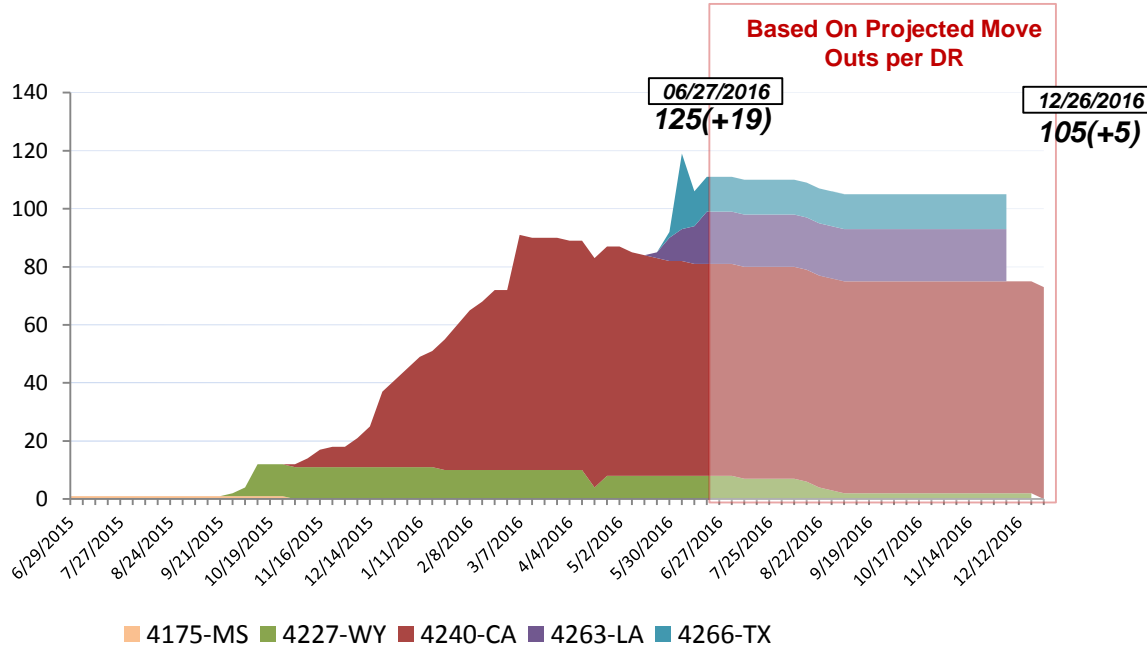

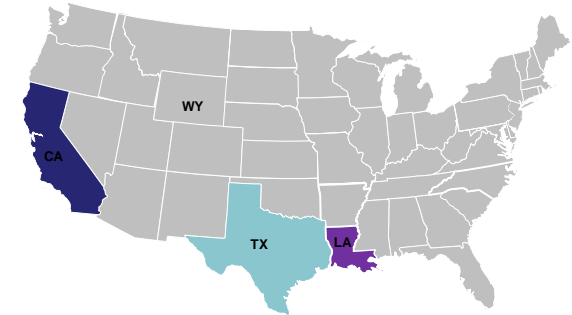

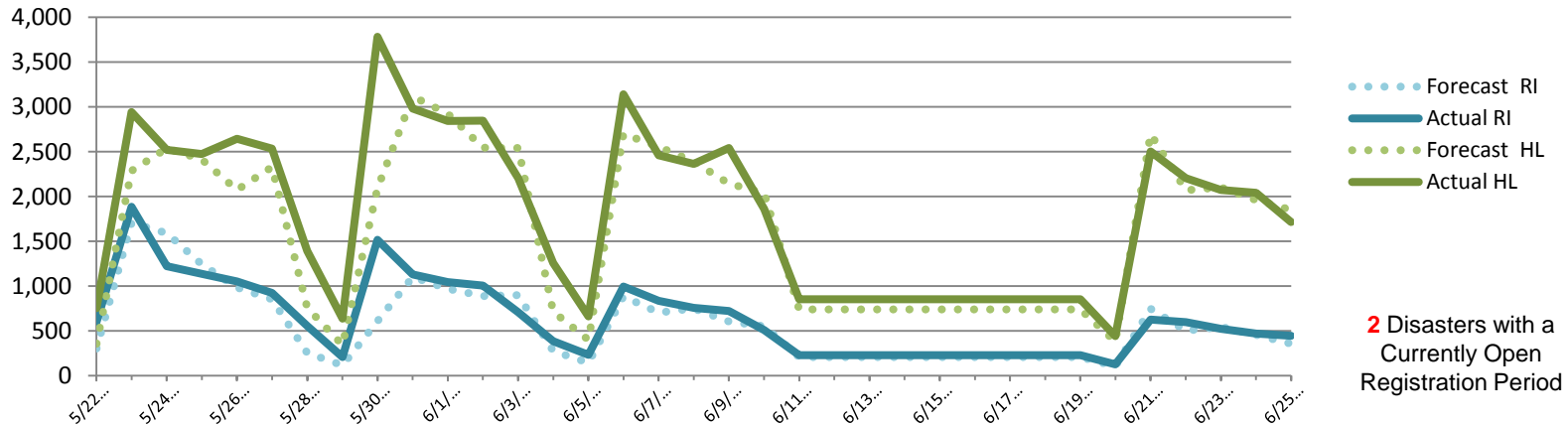

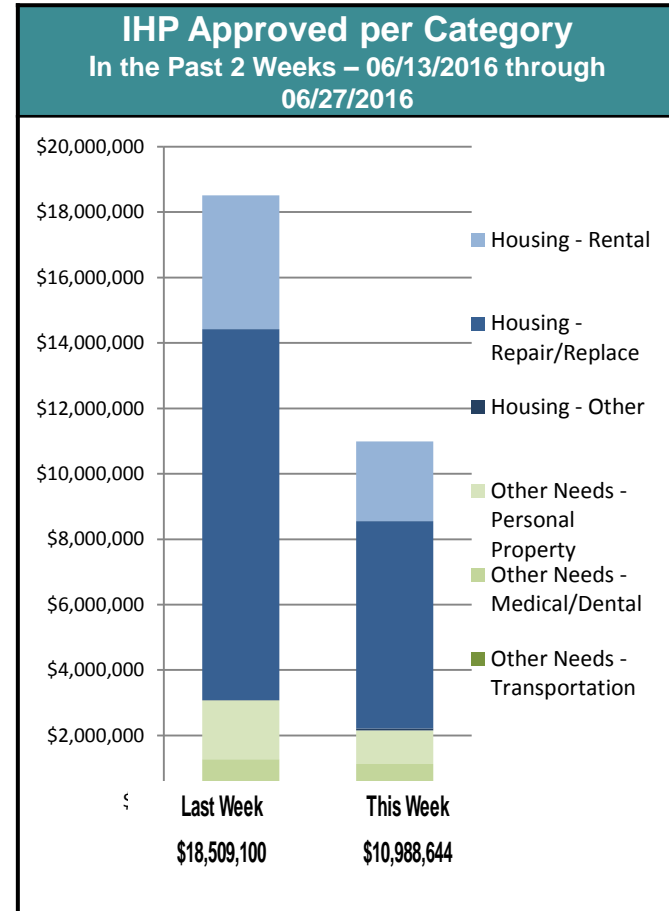
NPSC Call Forecasting and Actual Calls Over the Past 4 Weeks 05/29/2016 through 06/25/2016
