

- WV EOC at Full Activation
 - Governor lifted the State of Emergency for all but 11 counties in WV
- VA EOC at Partial Activation
- 4 Long Term care facilities remain evacuated



- Federal Staging Area (FSA) and IOF established in Charleston, WV




National Weather Forecast


Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day






Tropical Outlook – Atlantic





Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific








