- Many river basins are slowly receding; most are expected to crest by the end of the week

- 18 confirmed fatalities
- Evacuations (voluntary and mandatory) remain in effect; some have been lifted
- 15 shelters open with 300 occupants (ESF-06 as of 5:37 am EDT)







- 16k (peak 47k) customers remain without power across FL (\*Eagle-I as of 7:15 a.m. EDT, June 7; Customer outage data is provided by the Department of Energy's EAGLE system. Comprehensive National coverage of all electrical service providers is not available.)




**Tropical Storm Colin:** (Advisory #8A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)






# Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day








