# River Flooding - FINAL



## Current Situation:

- Response is transitioning from response to recovery as river basins slowly begin to recede
- Many river basins are slowly receding; most are expected to crest by the end of the week

## Impacts:

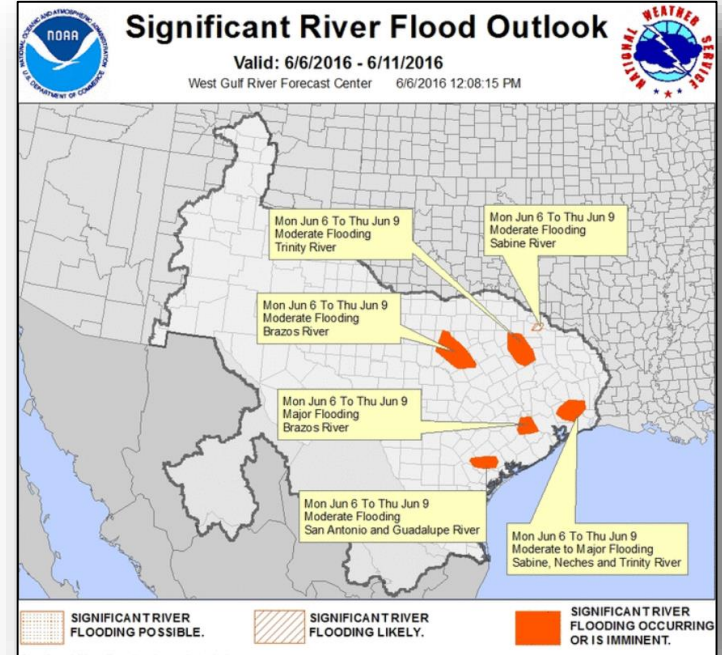
- 18 confirmed fatalities
- Evacuations (voluntary and mandatory) remain in effect; some have been lifted
- 15 shelters open with 300 occupants *(ESF-06 as of 5:37 am EDT)*

## State/Local Response:

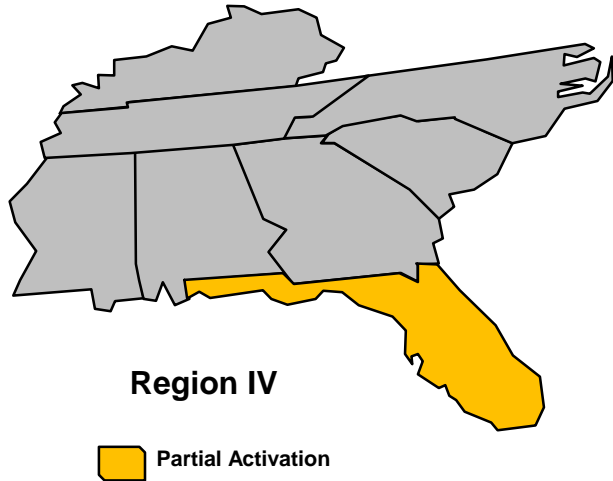
- US&R TX TF-1 assisting with water rescues and search efforts
- TX & LA EOCs remain at Monitoring
- TX Governor declared a State of Disaster for 31 counties on June 1

## FEMA Response:

- FEMA Region VI RWC returned to Watch/Steady State on June 6
- LNO deployed to TX EOC



# Tropical Storm Colin – Impacts / Response



## State/local Impacts / Response:

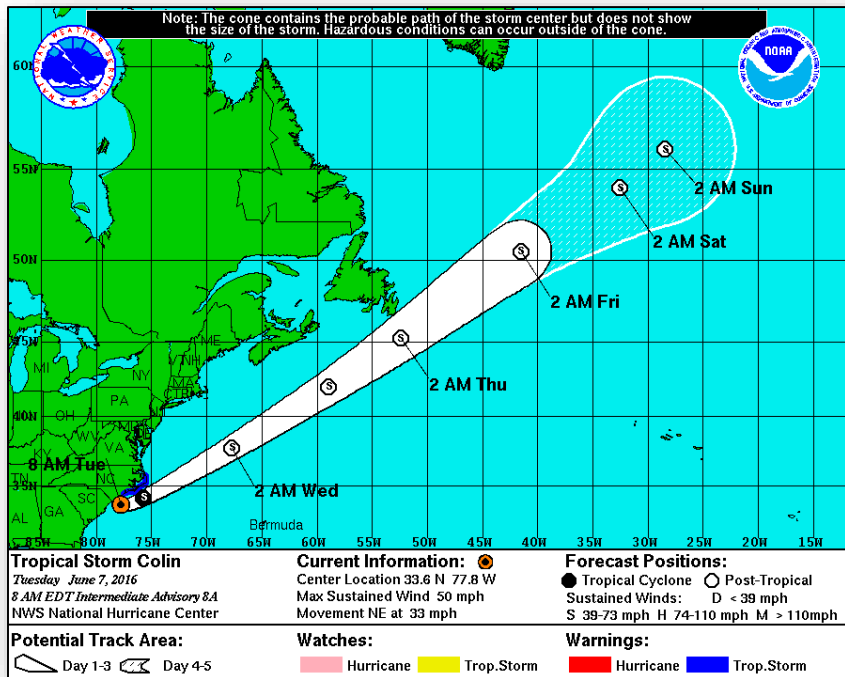
### Florida:

- FL EOC at Partial Activation; all other state EOCs remain at Normal Operations
- FL Governor declared a state of emergency on June 5 for threatened counties
- Heavy rain, strong winds and wind damage reported across multiple counties
- No major protective actions or evacuations in effect
- No shelters open; 2 on stand-by
- 16k (peak 47k) customers remain without power across FL *(\*Eagle-I as of 7:15 a.m. EDT, June 7; Customer outage data is provided by the Department of Energy's EAGLE system. Comprehensive National coverage of all electrical service providers is not available.)*

### FEMA Response:

- Region IV RRCC not activated
- Region IV RWC at Watch Steady-State
- LNO deployed to FL EOC
- Region IV IMAT and pre-identified FCO on Alert
- NWC at Watch/Steady State
- NRCC not activated
- No unmet needs and no requests for FEMA assistance

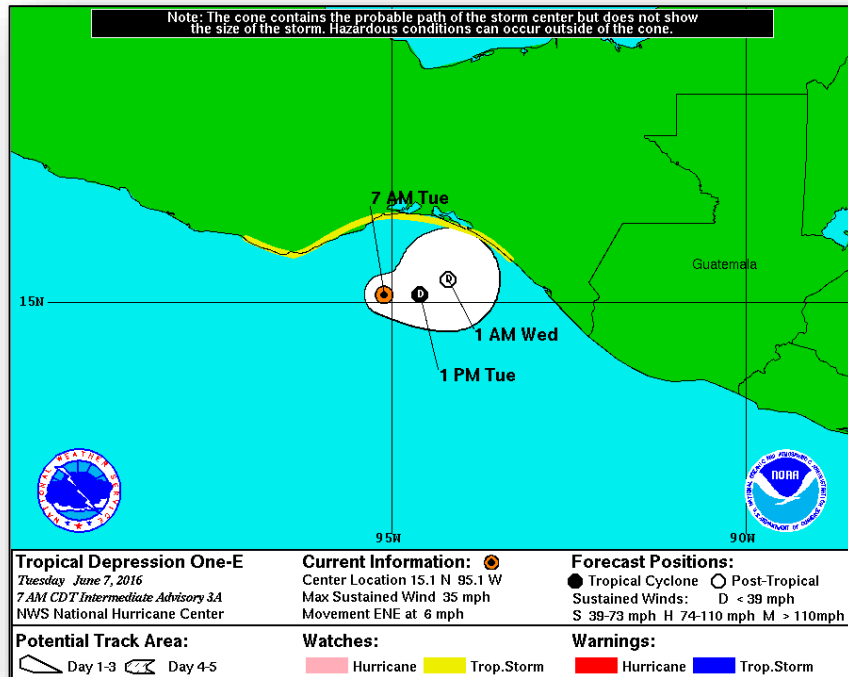
# Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



## Tropical Storm Colin: (Advisory #8A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 45 miles S of Wilmington, NC
- Moving NE at 33 mph
- This motion expected to continue with increase in forward speed expected today and tonight
- Center should move near and parallel to NC coast this morning, then offshore well east of Mid-Atlantic coast later today
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Some increase in strength expected next 24 hours but expected to lose its tropical cyclone characteristics by tonight
- Tropical storm force winds extend 230 miles
- Tropical Storm Warning in effect for NC
- Additional rainfall amounts of 1-3 inches across eastern NC and central FL through today
- Storm surge of 1-2 feet from Apalachicola to Naples, FL
- A tornado or two possible across parts of the coastal Carolinas today

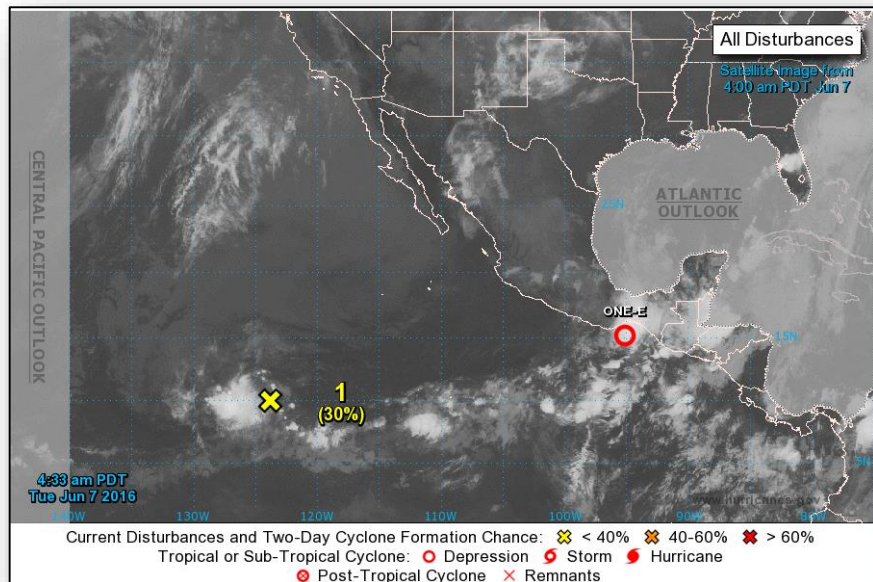
# Tropical Outlook – Tropical Depression One-E



## Tropical Depression One-E: (Advisory #3A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 70 miles S of Salina Cruz, Mexico
- Moving ENE at 6 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Weakening forecast next couple of days
- Expected to become a remnant low by Wed morning

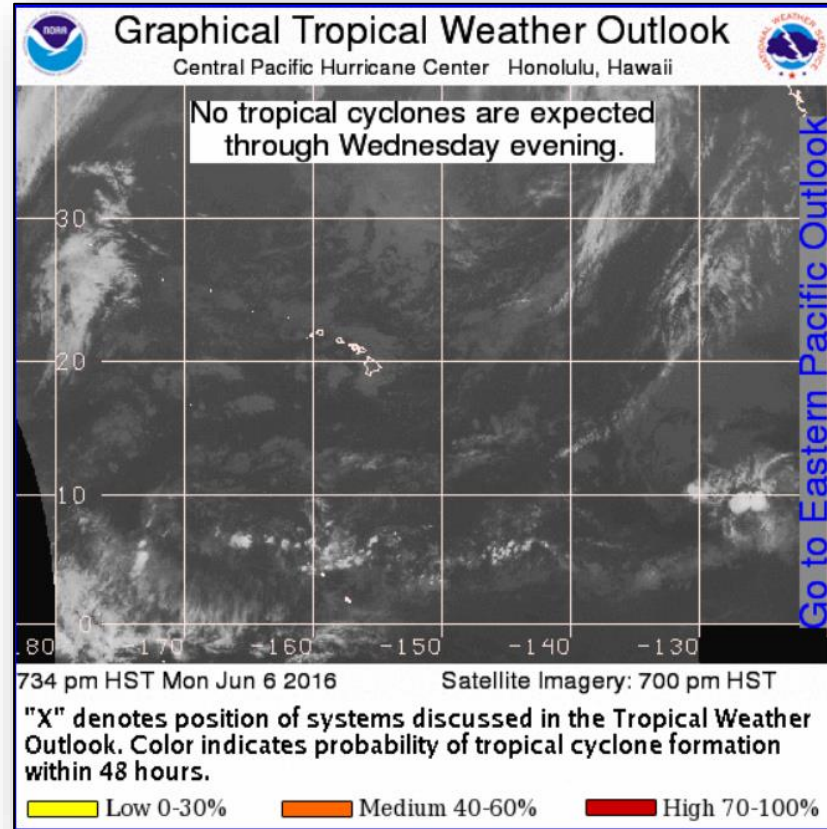
# Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



## Disturbance 1: (As of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

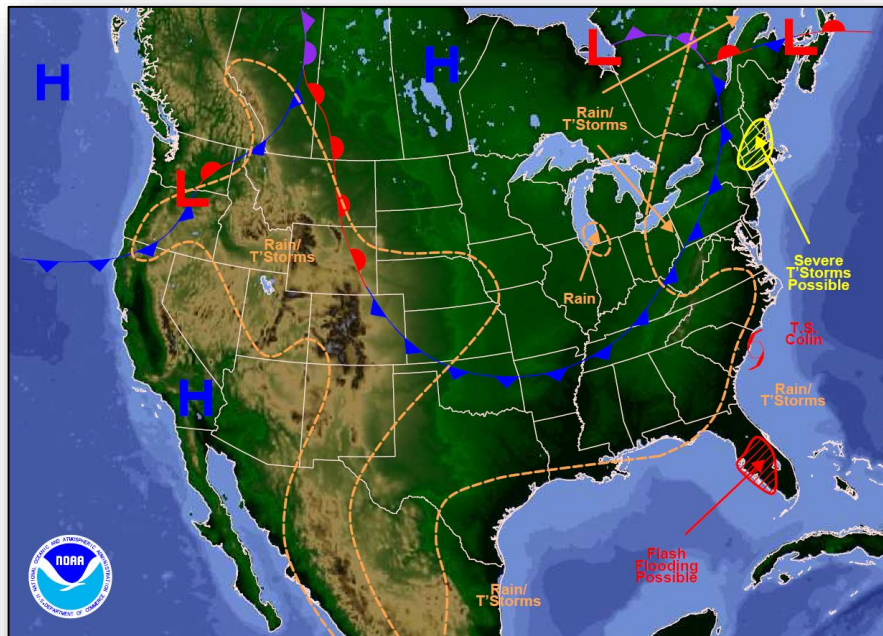
- Located 1,350 miles SW of southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Moving slowly W
- Some development possible next day or two before conditions become less conducive

- Formation chance through 5 days: LOW (30 %)

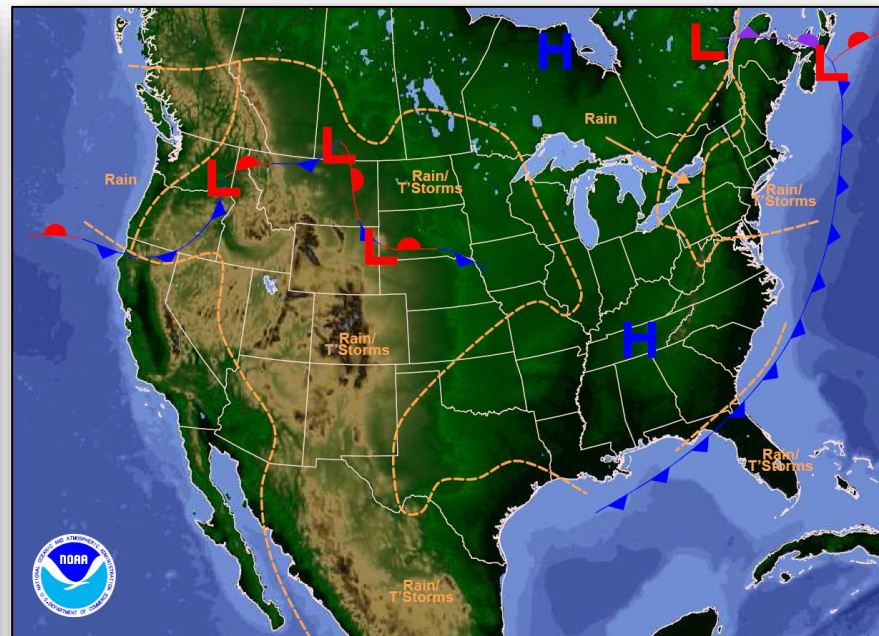

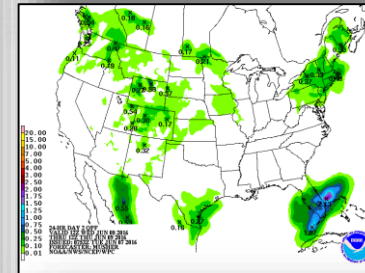
# Precipitation Forecast, 1-3 Day



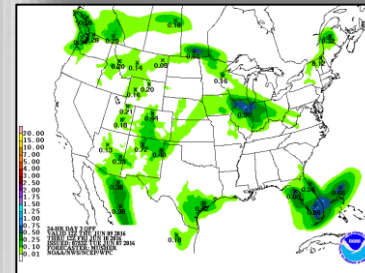

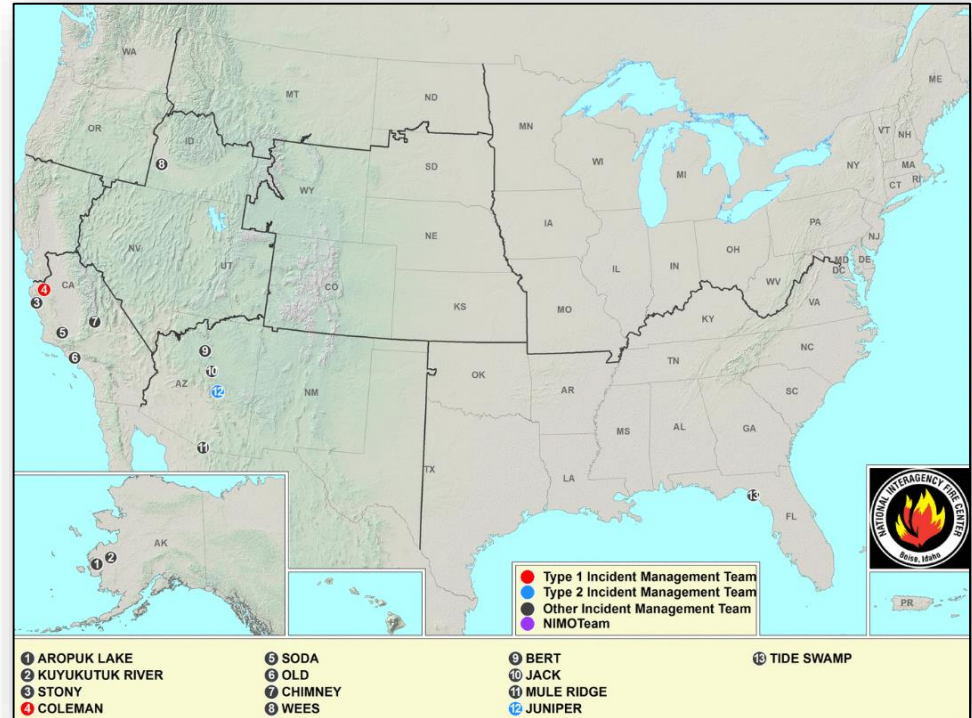


# National Fire Activity – June 7

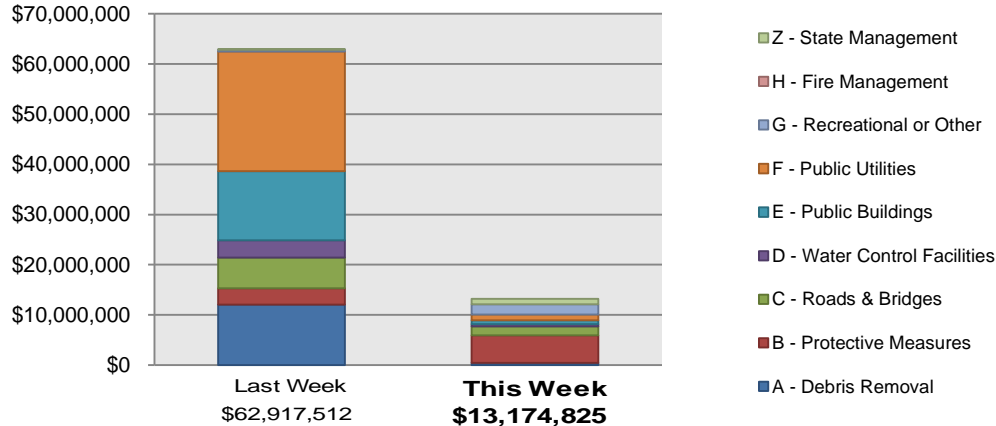
