# Significant Activity - August 13-14



**Significant Events:** Gulf Coast Flooding

**Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic – No tropical cyclones expected next 48 hours
- Eastern Pacific – Disturbance 1 (Low 0%), Disturbance 2 (Low 10%)
- Central Pacific – No tropical cyclones expected through Tuesday morning

- Excessive Heat Advisories/Warnings – Mid-Atlantic to New England

- Space Weather – No space weather observed past 24 hours; no space weather predicted for next 24 hours

# Flooding – Gulf Coast



## Current Situation

- Several days of very heavy rainfall has resulted in flooding and flash flooding across the Gulf Coast.

## Impacts

### Mississippi

- 4 (+2) injuries; no fatalities
- 48 homes/mobile homes and 7 apartment units uninhabitable in Wilkinson & Amite counties; 1 commercial building destroyed in Copiah County
- Mandatory evacuations in effect for town of Crosby (pop. 318) in Amite & Wilkinson counties, and Osyka (pop. 481) in Pike County
- 1 shelter open with 67 occupants (*ARC Midnight Shelter Count, 6:54 am EDT*)
- 39 local roads closed/flooded; portions of Highway 24 in Pike County affected by flooding
- Amtrak service restored from Chicago to New Orleans near Osyka
- No significant power outages

### Louisiana

- No confirmed fatalities (1 previously reported); media reports 2-4
- Over 2,500 homes impacted across 6 parishes
- Medical infrastructure remains at normal operations
- 70 roads closed due to high water including portions of I-10, I-12 and I-55 near Baton Rouge
- 500 inmates in Livingston Parish evacuated due to backed up sewage caused by flood waters
- 31 shelters open with 2,856 occupants (*ARC Midnight Shelter Count, 6:54 am EDT*)
- 31k customers without power (*DOE Eagle-I as of 6:45 a.m. EDT*)

6 - 10 Day Temperature Probability





