Current Situation

- Significant river flooding will persist into this weekend across portions of southern LA due to the heavy rainfall that occurred late last week
- Major flooding will mainly be along portions of the Mermentau and Vermilion rivers in LA over the next several days, with moderate flooding along the Amite and Calcasieu rivers continuing through the weekend




River Flood Outlook






Precipitation Forecast - Days 1-3



Severe Weather Outlook - Days 1-3






