
Tropical Storm Karl (Advisory #24 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)






Tropical Outlook - Central Pacific






Tropical Outlook – West Pacific






Precipitation Forecast - Days 1-3






Flash Flood Outlook - Days 1 & 2




