- Minor fluctuations in intensity and direction expected next 48 hours but expected to remain a powerful hurricane through Monday night
- Hurricane force winds extend 25 miles; tropical storm force winds extend 205 miles
- Hurricane Watches and Warnings in effect for non-US interests
- Swells affecting coast of Puerto Rico are likely to cause lifethreatening surf and rip currents













Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific






Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific




Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3






Fire Weather Outlook











