







Analysis of GOES-R imagery indicating Bogoslof ash and dust cloud after the December 22 eruption Courtesy of University of Wisconsin-Madison






#### Precipitation Forecast – Days 1-3





### Forecast Snowfall – Days 1-3






#### Forecast Ice






#### 6-10 Day Outlooks


